SURVEYORS TO ELECTRONICALLY FILE SURVEYS; AND TO MAKE
RECOMMENDATIONS."

Amendment No. 1 to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 22.

Amend Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 22 as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete line 13 and substitute the following:
"THE FEASIBILITY OF LICENSED LAND SURVEYORS TO FILE LAND"

AND

PAGE 1, delete line 22 and substitute the following:
"THE FEASIBILITY OF SURVEYORS TO ELECTRONICALLY"

AND

Page 1, delete line 30 and substitute the following:
"WHEREAS, members of the surveying profession would benefit the general public by Internet access of surveys done statewide;

WHEREAS, Internet accessibility of online surveys would substantially lessen travel requirements of surveyors;

WHEREAS, accessibility and availability of land surveys on the Internet would provide a uniform index of surveys;

WHEREAS, circuit clerks in counties across our state would save thousands of dollars in supplies and labor to accommodate manual filing of surveys in the county courthouses;

WHEREAS, realtors, appraisers, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, and other professionals would benefit from accessibility and availability of surveys online;

WHEREAS, access to a uniform index of survey online would diminish the

cost of real estate transactions;

WHEREAS, a uniform index of surveys would provide an additional source of data for the Geographic Information System being constructed by the State Land Information Board,

Page 1, delete line 35 and substitute the following:
"Technology is requested to perform an interim study on the feasibility of licensed land surveyors to"
