## **Amendment Form**

#### Subtitle of House Bill No. 2213

"AN ACT TO INCREASE FEES FOR THE ALCOHOLISM EDUCATION OR TREATMENT PROGRAM."

### Amendment No. 1 to House Bill No. 2213.

Amend House Bill No. 2213 as originally introduced:

Page 2, line 7, delete "§§ 5-65-103 or 5-65-303" and substitute "§ 5-65-103"

AND

Page 2, line 13, delete "<u>one hundred dollars (\$100)</u>" and substitute "<u>seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)</u>"

AND

Page 2, line 16, delete "or" and substitute "program or alcoholism"

AND

Page 2, line 30, delete "Program." insert "Program <u>or alcoholism treatment</u> <u>program, or both</u>."

AND

Page 2, delete lines 35 and 36

AND

Page 3, delete lines 1 through 6 and substitute the following:

"(3) The alcohol and driving education program may collect a program fee of up to fifty dollars (\$50.00) seventy-five (\$75) per enrollee to offset program costs.

(4) A person ordered to complete an alcohol and driving education program <u>or an alcoholism treatment program</u> under this section may be required to pay, in addition to the costs collected for the program, a fee of up to twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to offset the additional costs associated with reporting requirements under this subchapter."



#### AND

Page 3, line 7, delete "(5)(3)" and substitute "(5)"

AND

Immediately following SECTION 3 add the following additional SECTION: "SECTION 4. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE.</u> It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that if the fees that are raised by this bill do not become effective by July 1, 2003, there will be a shortfall in the funding needed to maintain the alcoholism education programs; that these programs are mandated by law for those individuals that have their license suspended or revoked following an arrest for driving while intoxicated; and that these programs provide educational instruction and are necessary to protect the public health and welfare.. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2003."

The Amendment was read the first time, rules suspended and read the second time and
