Subtitle of House Bill No. 1310 "TO INCREASE THE APPLICATION AND CONTRACT FEES OF THE ARKANSAS CEMETERY BOARD."

Amendment No. 1 to House Bill No. 1310.

Amend House Bill No. 1310 as originally introduced:

Page 2, line 12, delete "one thousand dollars (\$1,000)" and substitute "one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500)"

AND

Page 2, line 14, delete "one hundred dollars (\$100)" and substitute "four hundred dollars (\$400)"

AND

Page 3, line 32, delete "five hundred dollars (\$500)" and substitute "three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$325)"

AND

Page 3, delete lines 33 through 36, and substitute the following: "(2)(A) <u>A fee of seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) for each</u>

burial sale contract entered into after July 1, 2005, by the cemetery company regardless of the number of spaces sold under the contract regarding plots, crypts, and niches."


AND

Page 4, delete lines 5 through 36 and substitute the following: "SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 20-17-1026(a), concerning permit renewal

fees, is amended to read as follows:

(a) On By March 1 of each year, each permit holder shall pay to the Arkansas Cemetery Board a permit renewal fee in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100).

SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this act concerns the amounts



of fees paid to the Arkansas Cemetery Board; that the receipt of fees as amended by this act will affect the internal practices and procedures of the board; and that the board's operations and services will be best served by implementing the fees prescribed by this act at the earliest practicable date. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."
