Subtitle of Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 17

"COMMENDING MR. LEON ZULPO FOR HIS YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE STATE OF
ARKANSAS AND HIS LOCAL COMMUNITY."

Amendment No. 1 to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 17.

Amend Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 17 as originally introduced:

Add Representative Kenney as a cosponsor of the resolution

AND

Page 1, delete lines 19 through 27, and substitute the following:

"WHEREAS, Mr. Leon Zulpo was born in Tontitown, Arkansas, in 1928; and

WHEREAS, Tontitown, Arkansas, was founded in 1899 by settlers from Italy, one of whom was Mr. Zulpo's father; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Zulpo stepped down in January 2005 after serving forty-six (46) years on the Tontitown City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Municipal League believes Mr. Zulpo may be the longest-serving alderman in modern Arkansas state history; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Zulpo first took office in 1959, and since then he has helped the city in many ways, including successfully lobbying then-Congressman John Paul Hammerschmidt for a Federal Housing Administration loan to install city water after the city had been turned down repeatedly; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Zulpo helped start the city's volunteer fire department in 1979; has served on its board of directors since then; has served as a captain and as fire chief; and remains a member of the auxiliary; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Zulpo is a former chairman of the community's Grape Festival and is an active member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church; and

WHEREAS, although Mr. Zulpo has stepped down from his position on the city council, he will continue to take an interest in the town and has definite opinions about how its future should unfold; and



WHEREAS, the Senate commends Mr. Zulpo for his forty-six (46) years of service to the State of Arkansas and his local community,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Senate commends Mr. Leon Zulpo for his years of service to the State of Arkansas and his local community, and, upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate copy shall be forwarded to Mr. Leon Zulpo by the Secretary of the Senate."
