Amendment No. 1 to House Bill No. 2029.
Amend House Bill No. 2029 as originally introduced:
Page 1, line 31 add the following: "SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

August, 2007; that curricula must be established and facilities and equin place before the academic year begins; that Arkansas students may mis

General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the academic year begins in August, 2007; that curricula must be established and facilities and equipment in place before the academic year begins; that Arkansas students may miss the opportunity provided in this act if needed courses, facilities, and equipment are not in place before August, 2007; and that any delay in the effective date of this act may cause irreparable harm to the educational and employment opportunities of young people who hope to graduate early. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

- (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
- (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."
