CONTAINS A RADIO FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION TAG."

**Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill No. 195.**

Amend Senate Bill No. 195 as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete lines 10 through 12 and substitute:

"CREATING THE "LIMITATION ON USE OF RADIO FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION TAGS ACT"  
THAT PROHIBITS RFID TAGS FROM BEING USED FOR THE PURPOSE OF GATHERING OR  
DISSEMINATING INFORMATION RELATED TO THE DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE PURCHASER AFTER  
SALE;"

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"TO PROTECT THE CONSUMERS IN THE STATE BY  
CREATING THE "LIMITATION ON USE OF RADIO  
FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION TAGS ACT" THAT  
PROHIBITS RFID TAGS FROM BEING USED  
AFTER SALE."

AND

Page 1, delete lines 28 through 29 and substitute:

"This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Limitation on  
Use of Radio Frequency Identification Tags Act"."

AND

Page 2, delete lines 3 through 8 and substitute:

"4-110-203. Use after sale prohibited.

An RFID tag shall not be used for the purpose of gathering or  
disseminating information related to the demographics of the purchaser of a  
product by any person or entity after the product is:

- (1) Sold at the retail level; and
- (2) Removed from the premises of the retail establishment that



is the site of the sale."
