Subtitle of Senate Bill No. 1128 TO CREATE A PALLIATIVE CARE COUNCIL WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill No. 1128

Amend Senate Bill No. 1128 as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

- "SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 8, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:
- 20-8-701. Arkansas Palliative Care and Quality of Life Interdisciplinary Advisory Council - Establishment - Membership.
- (a) To improve the quality and delivery of patient-centered and family focused care in Arkansas, there is established the Arkansas Palliative Care and Quality of Life Interdisciplinary Advisory Council within the Department of Health.
 - (b) The members of the advisory council shall include:
- (1) The Director of the Department of Health or his or her designee;
- (2) The Director of the Department of Human Services or his or her designee;
- (3) The Director of the Arkansas Center for Health Improvement or his or her designee; and
- (4) The following additional members appointed by the Director of the Department of Health:
- (A) At least one (1) board-certified hospice and palliative medicine physician;
 - (B) At least one (1) hospice and palliative care nurse;
 - (C) At least three (3) representatives of licensed

hospices;

- (D) At least one (1) member of the general public, representing patients and family caregivers; and
- (E) Other representatives of health professionals with palliative care work experience or expertise in palliative care delivery models, or both, in a variety of inpatient, outpatient, and community settings and with a variety of populations, including pediatric, youth, and adult populations.
 - (c) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section:
 - (1) A member shall serve a term of three (3) years; and
 - (2) The term of a member may be renewed.

- $\underline{\mbox{(d)}}$ A member shall serve at the pleasure of the member's appointing authority.
- (e) A member shall not receive compensation for serving on the advisory council, but may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of the member's duties for the advisory council.
- <u>20-8-702. Duties of Arkansas Palliative Care and Quality of Life</u> Interdisciplinary Advisory Council.
- (a) The members of the Arkansas Palliative Care and Quality of Life Interdisciplinary Advisory Council shall elect a chair and vice chair whose duties shall be established by the advisory council.
- (b)(1) The Director of the Department of Health shall fix a time and place for regular meetings of the advisory council.
- (2) The advisory council shall meet at least two (2) times yearly.
- (c) The advisory council shall consult with and advise the Department of Health on matters related to the establishment, maintenance, operation, and outcomes evaluation of palliative care initiatives in the state."
