Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill No. 665

Amend Senate Bill No. 665 as engrossed, S3/16/17 (version: 03/16/2017 04:01:50 PM):

Page 10, line 1, delete "<u>twelve (12) months</u>" and substitute "<u>ninety (90)</u> <u>days</u>"

AND

Page 11, delete line 22, and substitute the following: "by a physician in the same specialty as the physician making the request, by a physician in another appropriate specialty, or by a pharmacologist."

AND

Page 15, delete lines 17 and 18, and substitute the following: "the healthcare insurer or utilization review entity shall provide the new pharmacy benefits manager with adequate"

AND

Page 15, line 20, delete "therapy; or" and substitute "therapy."

AND

Page 15, delete lines 21 through 24

AND

Page 15, delete lines 26 and 27, and substitute the following: "review entity may require the utilization of step therapy if:"

Page 15, delete lines 29 and 30, and substitute the following: "condition or an existing therapy is considered clinically appropriate for

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treatment of the patient's condition; or"

Page 16, delete line 1

Page 16, delete line 16, and substitute the following: "physician responsible for making the adverse determination, and, in the event that the physician responsible for making the adverse decision is not available, a telephone number where a peer-to-peer contact with another physician regarding the adverse determination can be made;"

Page 18, delete lines 29 and 30, and substitute the following: "SECTION 13. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE.</u> It is found and determined by the <u>General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that healthcare insurers and</u> <u>utilization review entities are denying medically necessary healthcare</u> <u>services; that by changing the prior authorization procedure to prevent the</u> <u>denial of medically necessary healthcare services by healthcare insurers and</u> <u>utilization review entities, Arkansas consumers will receive proper</u> <u>healthcare; and that unless this act becomes effective on August 1, 2017,</u> <u>utilization review entities and healthcare insurers will not know the</u> <u>specific effective date by which changes in computer systems must be made so</u> <u>that patients will not face the likelihood of going without potentially life-</u> <u>saving healthcare treatment or their providers will not be forced to provide</u> <u>treatment without compensation. Therefore, an emergency is declared to</u> <u>exist, and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace,</u> <u>health, and safety shall become effective on August 1, 2017.</u>"
