Subtitle of House Bill No. 1290

TO AMEND THE PROVISIONS OF THE ARKANSAS CODE CONCERNING THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY; AND TO AUTHORIZE PHARMACISTS TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO AND ADMINISTRATION OF ORAL CONTRACEPTIVES.

Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1290

Amend House Bill No. 1290 as originally introduced:

Add Representative Scott as a cosponsor of the bill

AND

Add Senators Hester, Caldwell as cosponsors of the bill

AND

Page 1, delete line 29, and substitute the following: "and oral contraceptives;

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-92-115 is amended to read as follows: 17-92-115. Requirements for administering and dispensing under statewide protocol.
- (a) When initiating therapy and administering or dispensing, or both, under a statewide protocol, a pharmacist shall:
- (1) Notify the primary care provider of the patient of any drug or device furnished to the patient or enter the appropriate information in a patient record system shared with the primary care provider, as permitted by the primary care provider;
- (2) Provide the patient with a written record of the drugs or devices furnished and advise the patient to consult a physician of the patient's choice, if the patient does not have a primary care provider; and
- (3)(A) Make a standardized fact sheet available to the recipient of the drug or device.
- (B) The standardized fact sheet shall include without limitation:
- (i) The indications and contraindications for the use of the drug or device;

(ii) The appropriate method for the use of the drug

or device;

- (iii) The need for medical follow-up; and
- (iv) Other appropriate information.
- (b)(1) When initiating therapy and administering and dispensing oral contraceptives under § 17-92-101(16)(A)(i)(h), a pharmacist shall:
- (A) Complete a training program related to oral contraceptives and approved by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy; and
 (B)(i) Screen a patient seeking oral contraceptives to assess whether the patient has been seen by a primary care practitioner or women's healthcare practitioner within the previous six (6) months.
- (ii) If the patient has not been seen by a primary care practitioner or women's healthcare practitioner within the previous six (6) months, the pharmacist shall:
- (a) Provide the patient with a referral to a local primary care practitioner or women's healthcare practitioner; and

 (b) Not dispense more than a six-month supply of oral contraceptives or the equivalent number of refills to the patient until the patient has a visit with a primary care practitioner or women's healthcare practitioner.
- (2) A pharmacist shall only initiate therapy or administer and dispense oral contraceptives under § 17-92-101(16)(A)(i)(h) to an individual who is eighteen (18) years of age or older."
