TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF CORPORAL PUNISHMENT ON A CHILD WHO HAS AN INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM.

Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 501

Amend Senate Bill No. 501 as originally introduced:

Page 1, line 10, "PUNISHMENT" and substitute "PUNISHMENT WITHOUT PARENTAL CONSENT"

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF CORPORAL PUNISHMENT WITHOUT PARENTAL CONSENT ON A CHILD WHO HAS AN INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM."

AND

Page 1, line 30, delete "corporal punishment" and substitute "corporal punishment, without consent from a parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis of a child,"

AND

Page 1, delete line 35, and substitute the following: "seq., as it existed on January 1, 2021.

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code \S 6-18-503(b)(3), concerning written student discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
- (3) A school district that authorizes use of corporal punishment under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall not:
- (A) Use corporal punishment <u>without consent from a parent,</u> <u>legal guardian</u>, or person standing in loco parentis of a child on a child who is:

(i) Is intellectually disabled, nonambulatory,



nonverbal, or autistic; or

(ii) Has an individualized education program in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., as it existed on January 1, 2021; or

(B) Include in its written student discipline policy a provision to allow the use of corporal punishment without consent from a parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis of a child on a child who is:

(i) Is intellectually disabled, nonambulatory, nonverbal, or autistic; or

(ii) Has an individualized education program in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., as it existed on January 1, 2021."
