Subtitle of Senate Bill No. 86

TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN LICENSURE ACT.

Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 86

Amend Senate Bill No. 86 as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete lines 8 and 9, and substitute the following:
"AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO STUDY AND REPORT ON THE STATUS
OF NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS IN ARKANSAS AND OTHER STATES; AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES."

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO STUDY AND REPORT ON THE STATUS OF NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS IN ARKANSAS AND OTHER STATES."

AND

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following: "SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. Naturopathic physician study and reporting.

- (a)(1) The Department of Health shall conduct a study regarding naturopathic physicians and the practice of naturopathic medicine.
 - (2) The study shall include without limitation:
- (A) The number of individuals engaging in the practice of naturopathic medicine in this state;
- (B) The education credentials of the individuals identified as engaging in the practice of naturopathic medicine in this state;
- (C) The geographic distribution of individuals engaging in the practice of naturopathic medicine in this state; and
 - (D) A survey of other states to determine:



(i) Which states recognize naturopathic physicians,
by that title or any other, or the practice of naturopathic medicine in state
law; and
(ii) For each state that recognizes naturopathic
physicians in state law:
(a) The methods by which naturopathic
physicians are recognized and regulated, whether by licensure, certification,
registration, or other lawful recognition;
(b) The entity responsible for governance and
regulation of naturopathic physicians and the practice of naturopathic
medicine and, if the entity is a board or committee, the composition of the
board or committee;
(c) The initial and ongoing requirements for
an individual to be recognized as a naturopathic physician, including
educational credentials, continuing education, examination requirements,
fees, and other requirements imposed by the state;
(d) Any delineation of or limitations to the
services an individual licensed as a naturopathic physician may perform and
the process for determining such delineation or limitations; and
(e) Any provisions in state law or regulation
regarding payment for services of naturopathic physicians by Medicaid,
commercial insurers, or other payors.
(b)(1) The department shall complete the study required by subsection
(a) of this section no later than June 30, 2024.
(2) The department shall submit a report on the study to:
(A) The Governor;
(B) The Speaker of the House of Representatives;
(C) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
(D) The House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and
Labor;
(E) The Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and
Labor;
(F) The Secretary of the Department of Health; and
(G) The Arkansas State Medical Board.
(3) The report shall be made publicly available on the
