Page 1, line 31, delete "younger;" and substitute "younger in the State of Arkansas;"

AND

Page 3, line 7, delete "<u>et seq.</u>, as it existed on January 1, 2025;" and substitute "<u>et seq.</u>;"

AND

Page 3, line 10, delete "as it existed on January 1, 2025,"

AND

AND

Page 3, line 11, delete "<u>that act, as it existed on January 1, 2025;</u>" and substitute "<u>that act;</u>"

Page 5, line 19, delete "or"

AND

Page 5, delete line 22, and substitute the following: "or a student engagement program; or (iv) Primarily provides career development opportunities, including without limitation professional networking, job skills, learning certifications, and job posting and application services;"

AND

Page 6, line 2, delete "<u>individual who is</u>" and substitute "<u>individual located</u> <u>in the State of Arkansas who is</u>"

AND

Page 7, delete lines 29 and 30, and substitute the following: "extent the processing is permitted under 15 U.S.C. § 6502, and its implementing regulations; or"

AND

Delete SECTION 2 in its entirety, and substitute the following: "SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.</u>

If any provision of this act or the application of this act to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this act are declared severable.

SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This act shall be effective on and after July 1, 2026."
