I) AGENCY SUMMARY & REVENUE SOURCES

MISSION

The Veterinary Medical Examining Board was created by Act 88 of 1915. Act 1741 of 2001 authorized a five member board to administer examinations for the purpose of licensing graduate veterinarians and veterinary technicians. The Board investigates infractions, conducts hearings and administers penalties for violation of its regulations.

TOTAL BIENNIAL BUDGET

The total budget of the Veterinary Medical Examining Board is \$115,816 the first year and \$113,285 the second year of the biennium.

FUNDING SOURCE

The budget is funded from special revenues generated by license and exam fees charged its member constituents.

II) CHANGES/APPROPRIATIONS

The operations appropriation funded by special revenue funds for \$115,816 the first year and \$113,285 the second year has a change level increase of \$4,000 in the first year to replace computer hardware and corresponding software in accordance with the agency's Information Technology plan.
