I) AGENCY SUMMARY & REVENUE SOURCES MISSION

This agency is responsible for determining disability for the Social Security Administration and for conducting administrative appeals for the Federal government.

TOTAL BIENNIAL BUDGET

The agency's budget for FY10 is \$27,763,236 and \$28,336,515 for FY11.

FUNDING SOURCE

The agency is 100% federally funded by the Social Security Administration.

II) CHANGES/APPROPRIATIONS

Increase in Federal Appropriation of \$3,219,332 in FY10 and \$3,517,786 in FY11.

- Restoration of 34 positions not budgeted in FY09 to continue to pursue the expansion of electronic health records and electronic transmissions.
- Increase in Overtime of \$250,000 each year with related Matching to continue previously authorized appropriation through Miscellaneous Federal Grant in FY09. This appropriation is necessary to eliminate a back log of cases by reviewing disability claims waiting for face-to-face hearings with Federal Administrative Law Judges.
- Increase in Operating Expenses of \$283,702 in FY10 and \$319,502 in FY11 for support services provided by the State including accounting, budgeting, purchasing, payroll, IT services and rent increase.
- Increase in Professional Fees of \$209,400 in FT10 and \$425,200 in FY11 due to increases afforded to contract doctors and medical fees related to an expected increase in disability claims.
- Increase in Capital Outlay of \$100,000 each year to restore the currently authorized appropriation level for anticipated equipment expenses.
