I) AGENCY SUMMARY & REVENUE SOURCES

MISSION

The Arkansas Minority Health Commission (AMHC) was created by Act 912 of 1991 to address the unique problems of the health status of Arkansas' minority population. The agency assesses the delivery of health services to minorities and identifies gaps in service to minorities, implements programs for minority health and makes recommendations for improvements.

TOTAL APPROPRIATION

The total appropriation for the Commission is \$1,820,052 for FY11.

FUNDING SOURCE

The budget is funded by general revenues through the State General Services Fund and Tobacco Settlement proceeds as well as a cash fund. They have separate appropriation acts.

IV) SPECIAL LANGUAGE

* Promotional Items - Special authority to create a Promotional Items appropriation to be used in the acquisition of promotional items.

* Transfer Restrictions - appropriations shall not be transferred but only as provided in this act.

* Transfer of Appropriations - in the event the amount of any of the budget classifications of maintenance and general operation are found to be inadequate, then the agency head may request a modification.

* Positions - Nothing in this act shall be construed as a commitment of the State to continue funding any position paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement.
