I) AGENCY SUMMARY & REVENUE SOURCES MISSION

The State Board of Chiropractic Examiners was created by Act 126 of 1915, as a Regulatory Board to authorize and regulate the practice of Chiropractic. The Board is responsible for licensing qualified Doctors of Chiropractic by examination, adopting and revising rules and regulations, making suitable by-law's for carrying out its duties, and generally serving as a regulatory, judicial, and disciplinary body for chiropractic practitioners. The Board consists of seven members, five of whom must be licensed chiropractors practicing in Arkansas for a period of at least five years, one consumer member and one senior citizen member.

TOTAL BIENNIAL BUDGET

The total budget of the 2011-13 biennium is \$140,888 the first year and \$142,316 the second year.

FUNDING SOURCE

The funding for this cash fund agency is derived from various licensure fees and penalties.
