I) AGENCY SUMMARY & REVENUE SOURCES

MISSION

The Arkansas Minority Health Commission (AMHC) was created by Act 912 of 1991 to address the unique problems of the health status of Arkansas' minority population. The agency assesses the delivery of health services to minorities and identifies gaps in service to minorities, implements programs for minority health and makes recommendations for improvements.

TOTAL AUTHORIZED

The total appropriation for the Commission is \$1,946,895 for FY13.

FUNDING SOURCE

The budget is funded by general revenues through the State General Services Fund and Tobacco Settlement proceeds as well as a cash fund. They have two separate appropriation acts. One includes the Minority Health Operations and Cash Appropriations which are funded by General Revenue and Cash and the other appropriation bill is for the Minority Health Initiative which is funded by Tobacco Settlement Funds.

Found in both appropriation bills:

Found in Tobacco Settlement Funded appropriation bill - Tobacco Settlement Special Language Items:

- * Transfer Restrictions appropriations shall not be transferred but only as provided in this act.
- * Transfer of Appropriations in the event the amount of any of the budget classifications of maintenance and general operation are found to be inadequate, then the agency head may request a modification.
- * Positions Nothing in this act shall be construed as a commitment of the State to continue funding any position paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement.
