Senator Robert F. Thompson of Paragould serves as State Senator for District 11, which comprises Clay, Greene and Lawrence counties and part of Craighead county. He is the Senate Majority Leader the Arkansas Senate.

During the 88th General Assembly, Senator Thompson serves as vice-chairman of Arkansas Legislative Council, chairman of the Claims Subcommittee of Joint Budget and co-chairman of the Arkansas Lottery Commission Advisory Council. He is a member of Joint Budget Committee; Senate Judiciary; Senate State Agencies and Governmental Affairs; Senate Efficiency Committee and the Arkansas Lottery Commission Oversight Committee.

Regionally and nationally, Senator Thompson has worked with legislators as a member of several organizations including the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) Law and Criminal Justice Committee, the Council of State Governments (CSG) Public Safety and Justice Task Force, and the Southern Legislative Conference (SLC) Agriculture and Rural Development Committee and the Energy and Environment Committee.

Thompson served a two-year term representing the District 78 in the Arkansas House of Representatives from 2005-2006 before his election to the Senate in 2007.
