Legislative Impact Statement

Bill: SB1168

Bill Subtitle: TO AUTHORIZE FOR CREATION AND ISSUANCE A SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE FOR PANCREATIC CANCER AWARENESS AND RESEARCH

Basic Change :

Senator Holland

The bill creates a Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Plate. The plate is to be designed by pancreatic awareness advocates of the state subject to approval by DFA. DFA is authorized to determine the number of applications, the amount of fees, or a combination thereof to be received for the initial order of the plates. Fees are the regular registration fee for the vehicle, a \$10.00 administrative fee to be deposited to the State Central Services fund, and \$25.00 fund raiser fee to be deposited monthly to the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network.

Revenue Impact :

Unknown increase in revenue to the State Central Services fund, and the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network, depending on the number of vehicle owners that register their vehicles with the new plate.

Taxpayer Impact :

Vehicles may be registered with a special plate to support the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network.

Resources Required :

A supply of the new plate will need to be acquired and maintained.

Time Required :

Adequate time is provided with a January 1, 2014 effective date.

Procedural Changes :

Program the motor vehicle system for issuance of the new plate.

Other Comments :

Legal Analysis :

SB1081 creates a new license plate for the Pancreatic Cancer Awareness. This plate is created in Title 27, Chapter 24, Subchapter 14 which authorizes the issuance of only special license plates created before April 13, 2005, license plates for organizations that represent a viewpoint that is different from a viewpoint license plate that existed before April 13, 2005, and special license plates to organizations that qualify for a license plate under § 27-24-1404. If the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network qualifies, a plate can be issued under § 27-24-1404. If it does not, creation of the plate under another subchapter would be in accordance with the purposes of Subchapter 14. The effective date is on and after January 1, 2014.
