Bill: SB56

BIII Subtitle: TO REQUIRE A FEE FOR A NEW RESIDENT REQUIRED TO REGISTER AS A SEX OFFENDER.

Basic Change :

Sen. J. Woods.

Would require that individuals convicted of a sex offense in another state and who subsequently move to Arkansas must register here and pay a \$250 registration fee within 90 days of registration. Funds collected as a result would be transferred to AOJ Sex and Child Offenders Registration Fund. Currently, individuals convicted of a sex offense in Arkansas must pay the \$250 registration fee into the fund and we do not anticipate a significant impact resulting from SB 56. A similar bill filed in 2011 failed to get out of committee.

Revenue Impact :

\$75,000 per year in fee collections. Funds collected as a result would be transferred to AOJ Sex and Child Offenders Registration Fund. ACIC estimates approximately 300 sex offenders move to Arkansas from other states each year.
