Legislative Impact Statement

Bill: SB311

Bill Subtitle: TO PERMIT A PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OR A DEPUTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY TO HAVE HIS OR HER POST OFFICE BOX LISTED AS HIS OR HER ADDRESS ON HIS OR HER DRIVER'S LICENSE.

Basic Change : Sponsor: Sen. Hester

Current law requires a residence address on the driver's license. However, a post office box may be used at the option of the licensee if the licensee is a law enforcement officer or the victim of domestic violence or the dependent of a victim of domestic violence. This bill would permit a prosecuting attorney or a deputy prosecuting attorney to have his or her post office box or office address listed on the license instead of the required residence address.

Revenue Impact :

There would be no revenue impact if this bill is passed.

Taxpayer Impact :

The taxpayer would be obligated to notify the Office of Driver Services of an address change when they are no longer a prosecuting attorney or deputy prosecuting attorney.

Resources Required :

Programming and training will be required if this bill is passed.

Time Required :

No additional time is required to implement this bill.

Procedural Changes :

If this bill is passed procedures would be changed to allow a post office box or office address to be used by prosecuting attorneys and deputy prosecuting attorneys. Documentation will need to be provided by the prosecuting attorneys or deputy prosecuting attorneys to verify they are elected or duly appointed, therefore entitled to use their post office address or office address on their license.

Legal Analysis :

SB311, as proposed, permits elected prosecuting attorneys and deputy prosecuting attorneys to list a post office box or office address instead of a residence address on his or her driver's license. If SB311 becomes law, the Office of Driver Services will need to train its service representatives the proper procedures to permit a prosecutor to list a post office box on his or her license.

There is no effective date or emergency clause.
