**I) AGENCY SUMMARY & REVENUE SOURCES**

**MISSION**

The Arkansas State Library serves as a resource for state government, for public libraries and for all Arkansas citizens, and offers services with an overall mission to provide all Arkansans with access to information. In addition, the State Library provides guidance and support for the development of local public libraries and library services. The agency administers state and federal funds appropriated for libraries and library development, including State Aid To Public Libraries funds and federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds (formerly Library Services and Construction Act). The State Library also is a regional depository for federal documents, and the official state depository and clearinghouse for state and local documents.

**TOTAL APPROPRIATION**

The total appropriation for the State Library is \$13,235,034.

**FUNDING SOURCES**

The appropriations for the State Library are funded by general revenue, federal funds, cash and fund balances.

**II) CHANGE LEVEL REQUESTS**

**LIBRARY - STATE OPERATIONS (APPROPRIATION 054)**

This appropriation is funded with general revenues and is used for the general operations of the Arkansas State Library. The total appropriation is \$3,632,872 and includes the following change:

**Regular Salaries and Personal Services Matching** - Increase of \$4,527 in appropriation and general revenue funding for reclassification of 3 positions.

**LIBRARY - FEDERAL OPERATIONS (APPROPRIATION 055)**

This appropriation promotes access to information resources in all types of libraries, promotes access to library materials through electronic networks, and provides linkages between libraries. This appropriation is funded by the U.S. Department of Education - Institute of Museum and Library Services. The total appropriation is \$3,281,540 and includes the following changes:

**Regular Salaries and Matching** - Increase of \$49,005 for the reclassification of 3 positions.

**Capital Outlay** - Increase of \$100,000 to purchase resources for the collection housed in the library and to purchase network equipment.

**GRANTS ADMINISTRATION - CASH IN STATE TREASURY (APPROPRIATION 1XV)**

This appropriation allows the State Library to expend cash grants awarded from sources such as the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation - U.S. Library Initiative. The total appropriation is \$614,000 and provides for the following changes:

**Operating Expenses** - Increase of \$200,000 in unfunded appropriation to maintain the current budget and have appropriation available for new grant opportunities.

**Grants and Aid** - Increase of \$200,000 in unfunded appropriation to maintain the current budget and have appropriation available for new grant opportunities.

**III) ADDITIONAL POSITIONS (Total FY2015 Authorized Positions: 56)**

Total Base Level Positions FY 2015: 56

Increase / (Decrease) over Base Level : 0

Extra Help Positions FY2016: 12 (Total FY2015 Authorized Extra Help: 12)

Reclassification of 2 positions: Librarian (C114) to Senior Librarian (C117) and Library Support Assistant (C107) to Library Technician (C109).

**IV) SPECIAL LANGUAGE**

**CARRY FORWARD:** Authorizes the agency to carry forward unexpended balances of general revenue funding allocated to the Books and Subscriptions line item in the agency's State Operations Appropriation. Requires prior statement of need for the carry forward to DFA - Office of Budget, report to ALC or Joint Budget Committee (JBC) of all carried forward amounts, report of status of funds carried forward to ALC/JBC, and finally include all of the above information in the biennial budget manuals or a statement of non-compliance.

\*NEW LANGUAGE\* **PROMOTIONAL ITEMS:** Authorizes the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to establish, upon request by the State Library, a special appropriation line item to be used in the acquisition of promotional items.
