Arkansas State Senator Jeremy Hutchinson is in his second term representing Senate District 33, which comprises portions of Pulaski and Saline Counties. He was elected to the Senate in 2010 and re-elected in 2012. He is chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee and the Joint Budget Claims Subcommittee. He is co-chairman of Arkansas Legislative Council Claims Review Subcommittee and the Legislative Criminal Justice Oversight Task Force. During the current 90th General Assembly, he holds membership on the following committees:

He was also as an Assistant Pro Tempore for the 89th General Assembly.

Regionally and nationally, Senator Hutchinson works with legislators across the country as a member of the Southern Legislative Conference (SLC), the American Legislative Exchange Council (ALEC) and the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL). He serves on the Energy and Environment Committee of SLC, the Civil Justice Committee of ALEC and the Law and Criminal Justice and Public Policy Committee of NCSL.

Senator Hutchinson served as State Representative for House District 31 in the Arkansas House of Representatives from 2000-2007. As State Representative, he served as Assistant Minority Leader and was a member of Joint Budget Committee, House Judiciary, Insurance and Commerce, Retirement and Pension Committee, and Joint Energy.

Professionally, Senator Hutchinson is a partner with the law firm of Steel Wright & Collier PLLC and is admitted to practice in all courts in the State of Arkansas, and the United States District Courts for the Eastern and Western Districts of Arkansas. In prior years, he worked for Hutchinson Law Firm, as a part-time deputy prosecutor in Saline County and an adjunct professor at John Brown University and Harding University where he taught employment law and economics. An active member of the Arkansas Bar Association, he serves on the association's Legislative Task Force and Committee for Modern Judiciary. He also has membership with the Pulaski County Bar Association and the Arkansas State Chamber of Commerce. During his political and professional career, he has been recognized by many organizations:
