# **Legislative Impact Statement**

# Bill: SB571 Bill Subtitle: TO AMEND THE LAW CONCERNING DRIVER RECORD INFORMATION; AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

#### Basic Change :

#### Sponsor: Sen. Sample

Current law provides that driving record fees in the amount of \$7.00 are distributed \$1.00 to the DFA Commercial Driver's License Fund and the remaining \$6.00 to the Arkansas Highway & Transportation Fund. This bill will increase the \$7.00 fee to \$10.00. The remaining \$3.00 of this increased fee will be distributed to the Arkansas State Police Fund to be used for the purchase of motor vehicles, any associated taxes, equipping costs, and other department operations.

#### Revenue Impact :

During the calendar year 2016, DFA distributed 1,270,888 driving records at \$7 each and collected \$8,896,216. Assuming the same number of records sold, the additional \$3 would increase fees collected by \$3,812,664.

#### Taxpayer Impact :

Taxpayers, including insurance companies, would pay an additional cost of \$3 for a driving record.

#### Resources Required :

Additional programming, estimated to cost \$6,000, is required.

#### Time Required :

This bill has an emergency clause which is not enough time. DFA would need at least 90 days to implement this bill.

#### Procedural Changes :

None.

## Other Comments :

## Legal Analysis :

This bill increases the fee charged for furnishing driving records to qualified requesters from \$7 to \$10. Under the current provisions of § 27-23-117, an employer or prospective employer requesting driving records is charged a fee of \$10 while any other qualified requester is charged the reduced rate of \$7. This amendment would make the fee consistent for the two categories of requesters. § 27-23-118 establishes the distribution of fees collected under § 27-23-117 and is amended to reflect the proposed fee increase. The extra \$3 collected under § 27-23-117(3) is directed to be deposited as special revenues to the credit of the Arkansas State Police Fund by the new provision of § 27-23-118(3). As this fee is classified as special revenue, the bill also amends § 19-6-301(148) to include reference to the new fee provision. The reference to the Arkansas State Police Fund in § 19-6-301(148) is then added to § 19-6-401(1). SB571 contains an Emergency Clause to make the effective date July 1, 2017.
