Senator Jason Rapert is serving his second term in the Arkansas Senate. He represents Senate District 35, which is comprised of parts of Faulkner and Perry Counties. Currently, in the 90<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, he is chairman of Senate Insurance & Commerce and chairman of Arkansas Legislative Council (ALC) Higher Education Subcommittee.
