Legislative Impact Statement

Bill: SB14

Bill Subtitle: CONCERNING THE FEE TO ATTEND A VICTIM IMPACT PANEL THAT IS REQUIRED BY LAW OF ANY PERSON CONVICTED OF DRIVING OR BOATING WHILE INTOXICATED, REFUSAL TO SUBMIT TO A CHEMICAL TEST, OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL BY A MINOR.

Basic Change :

Sponsor: Sen. Chesterfield

Currently, a person or underage person whose driving privileges are suspended or revoked for Driving or Boating While Intoxicated, Refusal to Submit to a Chemical Test or Possession of Alcohol While Underage must attend a victim impact panel sponsored by an organization approved by the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services of the Department of Human Services. The current cost to attend this program is \$10. This bill will increase the cost per enrollee to \$20.

A person who has suspended or revoked driving privileges may be required to pay \$20 to attend the victim impact panel and complete this requirement before they may have their driving privileges reinstated.
