Bill: SB32 As Engrossed: 2/4/2021 BIII Subtitle: TO AUTHORIZE CERTAIN PERMIT HOLDERS TO DELIVER ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DIRECTLY TO A CONSUMER. Basic Change : Sponsor: Sen. J. English and Rep. Brown House Amendment No. 1 --- SB32-H1 (engrossed on 2/4/2021) would also allow a microbrewery-restaurant or a small brewery permit holder to deliver alcoholic beverages in addition to a retail permit holder. Original Bill --- SB32 would allow a retail liquor permit holder to deliver alcoholic beverages directly to the private residence of a consumer 21 years of age in the wet county or territorial subdivision where the permit holder resides during operating hours. The alcoholic beverages shall be delivered by an employee of the retail liquor permit holder and not by a third-party delivery service or system. Revenue Impact : None. Taxpayer Impact: The holder of a microbrewery-restaurant, small brewery, or retail permit holder would be able to deliver alcoholic beverages directly to a private residence residing in the same county of the permit holder.
