House Amendment No. 1 --- HB1032-H1 (engrossed H3/01/23) provides that HB1032 would be effective for assessment years beginning on or after January 1, 2023.

Original Bill --- HB1032 increases the Homestead Property Tax Credit from \$375 to \$425. The Homestead Property Tax Credit reduces the amount of real property taxes due on a property owner's qualified homestead for each assessment year. To claim the credit, a property owner registers with the county assessor and provides proof of eligibility for the credit.
