

PURPOSE OF BILL HB1252

To modify the Arkansas Health Care Consumer Act; and to require coverage for prosthetic devices for athletics or recreation and prosthetic devices for showering or bathing.

PRICING APPROACH AND COMMENTS

House Bill 1252 requires that self-insured plans expand coverage of prosthetic devices to include coverage for prosthetic devices for athletics and recreation, and prosthetic devices for showering or bathing. All health plans, except EBD, confirmed that prosthetic devices for athletics and recreation and prosthetic devices for showering or bathing are currently covered as part of the plan. EBD currently covers prosthetic devices only for basic life activities.

EBD provided historical cost and utilization information that were used in combination with publicly available data to develop estimates of the total impact to the plan. EBD's historical cost information demonstrated an approximate cost of \$3 per 1,000 members for this coverage. Based on the utilization information provided by EBD and publicly available data, the additional cost of covering prosthetic devices for athletics and recreation and prosthetic devices for showering or bathing is immaterial.
