### REQUEST FOR SPECIAL LANGUAGE IN APPROPRIATION ACT

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## **UNIVERSITIES**

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#### AR HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

INSTITUTION REQUEST

TRANSFER RESTRICTIONS . The appropriations provided in this act shall not be transferred under the provisions of Arkansas Code 19- 4- 522, but only as provided by this act.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2022}{2023}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2023}{2024}$ .

TRANSFER PROVISIONS. The state-supported institution of higher education in this act may transfer appropriations between the various line items within each appropriation contained in this appropriation act. Such transfers shall be made only after the approval of the Division of Higher Education and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and the approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

The General Assembly has determined that the institution in this act could be operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution and that flexibility is being accomplished by providing authority to transfer between items of appropriation made by this act. Since the General Assembly has granted the institution broad powers under the transfer of appropriations, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the transfers by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee in the utilization of the transfer authority. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2022}{2023}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2023}{2024}$ .

#### AR HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

ARKANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM SHARED RESOURCES – In order to prevent unnecessary growth in positions and to incentivize shared services, campuses within the system may temporarily transfer such positions as necessary. The temporary transfer shall be approved by the president and the related chancellors and reported to the Arkansas Division of Higher Education. Temporary transfers may be considered for permanent placement by the General Assembly during the prescribed legislative budget process. - 6- 65- 307. Arkansas Tech STEM Institute.
- (a) Arkansas Tech STEM Institute shall be administered under the direction of Arkansas Tech University.
- (b) The institute shall utilize a multidisciplinary collaboration of professionals to explore, develop, implement, and evaluate new and better ways to integrate the teaching, study, and performance of the following for academic, economic, and economic development purposes in the state:
  - (1) Business;
  - (2) Engineering;
  - (3) Emergency management;
  - (4) Agriculture;
  - (5) Health care;
  - (6) Technical programs; and
  - (7) Computer sciences.

SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6- 64- 1012 is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

- 6- 64- 1012. Additional compensation for athletic department.
- (a) In recognition of the extra work involved in the participation of intercollegiate athletic teams in post- season competition, and to promote exceptional achievement in the total sports program, the Chancellor of the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, in accordance with policies issued by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas, may approve additional compensation of up to one (1) month's salary for the athletic department and band personnel when any athletic team participates in post-season competition or achieves exceptional recognition, which shall be in addition to the regular salaries authorized by law, provided that the additional compensation shall be paid from auxiliary income of the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville other than public state funds.
- (b) The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas is further authorized to make additional payments to employees in the Athletic Department at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, or to employees that directly support its operation, in such amounts as the Board of Trustees may determine is appropriate in view of the unusual and exacting duties of such employees, provided the additional compensation shall be paid from auxiliary income other than state funds.

#### **CURRENT SPECIAL LANGUAGE (WITH INST. REQUEST)**

ADDITIONAL PAYMENTS AUTHORIZED. The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas is hereby authorized to make additional payments to head and assistant coaches at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, from revenues generated by contracts with vendors of athletic apparel, shoes, multimedia rights, and other products in such amounts as may be established by the Board of Trustees for performance by the coaches of consulting and other obligations pursuant to contracts between the University and such vendors. Such additional payments to head and assistant coaches shall not be considered salary and shall not be deemed or construed to exceed the maximum salaries established for such coaches by the General Assembly. Nothing in this section shall be construed to reduce or eliminate the authority granted elsewhere in Arkansas statutes for the payment of allowances or bonuses to coaches at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2022 2023 through June 30, 2023 2024.

APPRENTICE PROGRAM WAGES . All apprentices in the University of Arkansas U.S . Department of Labor Approved Apprentice Program shall be appointed into the State of Arkansas Classified Pay Plan title of (C 105) Apprentice Tradesman at the then Labor Market Entry Rate.

Using successive Arkansas Department of Labor Prevailing Wage Determination (ADLPWD) Building Rates for Washington County for the craft title matching that Apprentice's craft training, individual Apprentices shall be paid progressively increasing wages upon successful completion of successive years of training for their craft. Progressively increasing, as strongly encouraged for this type program by the U.S. Department of Labor is defined as a percentage difference between the Apprentice's current salary and the next year's ADLPWD Washington County Building Rates Basic Hourly Rate for their chosen craft, but not less than the preceding year's wages with any authorized cost of living (COLA)—applied.

Upon successful completion of the Apprentice Program, fulfillment of all related licensing requirements, and availability of an open S killed Trades Worker position (if not already in a C 115 S killed Tradesman position), all Apprentice Program graduates shall be promoted to a C 115 S killed Tradesman position and earn the ADLPWD Washington County Building Rates Basic Hourly Rate for the classification of their chosen craft except that: "No Apprentice Program graduate shall earn wages less than C115 S killed Tradesman Entry Level."

CRIMINAL JUSTICE INSTITUTE TRANSFER PROVISION. (b) The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas may sell the property commonly known as the Pine Tree Research Station, located in St. Francis County, Arkansas, which was acquired by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas from the United States of America acting through the Forest Service in 1978, to: (1) A non-profit corporation organized with the primary mission to keep the land open to the public and available for public use; and (2) Organized and operated for a minimum of five (5) years. (c) The property commonly known as the Pine Tree Research Station, located in St. Francis County, Arkansas, which was acquired by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas from the United States of America acting through the Forest Service in 1978, shall remain open to the public for public use, including without limitation: (1) Public fishing; (2) Public hunting; (3) Biking; (4) Bird watching; and (5) Hiking. (d) All property commonly known as the Pine Tree Research Station, located in St. Francis County, Arkansas, which was acquired by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas from the United States of America acting through the Forest Service in 1978, in row crop cultivation in the year 2020 is exempt from subsection (c) of this section.

ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL RESEARCH PROGRAM. In any fiscal year, if the funds received by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the Arkansas Biosciences Institute in the Arkansas Biosciences Institute appropriation in this Act are less than the total amount appropriated, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall provide no less than thirty-three and one-third percent (33 and 1/3%) of the available funds for the Arkansas Children's Hospital Research Program. Otherwise, the Arkansas Children's Hospital Research Program line item appropriation in the Arkansas Biosciences Institute appropriation in this Act shall be funded in total or Arkansas Children's Hospital Chief Executive Officer may request that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences transfer such funds each fiscal year from the Arkansas Biosciences Institute Program Account to the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal funds used for Supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's Hospital.

TRANSFER RESTRICTIONS. The appropriations provided in this act shall not be transferred under the provisions of Arkansas Code 19-4-522, but only as provided by this act.

#### AR HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

INSTITUTION REQUEST

TRANSFER PROVISIONS. The state-supported institution of higher education in this act may transfer appropriations between the various line items within each appropriation contained in this appropriation act. Such transfers shall be made only after the approval of the Department Division of Higher Education and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and the approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

The General Assembly has determined that the institution in this act could be operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution and that flexibility is being accomplished by providing authority to transfer between items of appropriation made by this act. Since the General Assembly has granted the institution broad powers under the transfer of appropriations, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the transfers by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee in the utilization of the transfer authority. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

POSITIONS. (a) Nothing in this act shall be construed as a commitment of the State of Arkansas or any of its agencies or institutions to continue funding any position paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement in the event that Tobacco Settlement funds are not sufficient to finance the position.

- (b) State funds will not be used to replace Tobacco Settlement funds when such funds expire, unless appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized by the Governor.
- (c) A disclosure of the language contained in (a) and (b) of this Section shall be made available to all new hire and current positions paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement by the Tobacco Settlement Commission.
- (d) Whenever applicable the information contained in (a) and (b) of this Section shall be included in the employee handbook and/or Professional Services Contract paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2022}{2023}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2023}{2024}$ .

Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by Initiated Act 1 of 2000, the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

EXTRA HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas For for Medical Sciences, the following number of parttime part-time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a Nursing PRN Pool; four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rated rates of pay not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act. If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s) must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget request.

#### AR HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

EXTRA HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualifies qualified individuals in a UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2022}{2023}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2023}{2024}$ .

SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 23, Chapter 18, is amended to add an additional subchapter to codify special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

<u>Subchapter 12 - Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Grant Program 23-18-1201. This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Grant Program".</u>

23-18-1202. Legislative findings and intent.

- (a) The General Assembly finds that:
- (1) Generally, local entities do not budget for or have funds available for broadband due-diligence business studies in connection with making application for federal grants or loans for broadband development programs;
- (2) <u>In order to spur further development of broadband in rural Arkansas, it is necessary for local entities to conduct due-diligence business studies before applying for federal grants or loans for broadband development programs;</u>
- (3) Expenses associated with broadband due-diligence business studies can be burdensome to rural Arkansas communities, and it is in the best interest of all Arkansans to make an investment to develop broadband in rural areas;
- (4) Under current Arkansas law, only certain eligible telecommunications carriers have benefitted from the Arkansas High Cost Fund under § 23-17-404, which underwrites broadband deployment; and
- (5) <u>It is necessary to provide funds to local entities to further widespread broadband deployment, particularly in unserved and underserved rural Arkansas, and to determine the feasibility of broadband deployment for local entities</u>

that currently do not have federally defined broadband services and where these broadband due-diligence business studies have not been conducted before.

- (b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to provide funds to local entities to defray expenses for broadband due-diligence business studies in connection with preparations for federal grant and loan applications for broadband development programs administered by the Federal Communications Commission, the United States Department of Agriculture, or another federal agency to spur federally defined broadband development in rural Arkansas.
- <u>23-18-1203.</u> Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Management of grant application process.
- (a) The Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall manage the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant application process for local entities to receive funds under the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund.
  - (b) The institute for Digital Health and Innovation shall:
- (1) <u>Determine Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund</u> grantees;
- (2) <u>Promulgate rules necessary to implement this act;</u>
  (3)(A) <u>Determine the amount of the Rural Broadband I.D.</u>
  Expenses Trust Fund grant funds disbursed to an applicant.
- (B) An applicant may be a prospective and qualified applicant for a federal grant or loan for a broadband development program under the federal regulations promulgated by the Federal Communications Commission, the United States Department of Agriculture, or another federal agency;

- (4) Make the determination if the grants shall be awarded; and
- (5) Inform the Treasurer of State when a determination is made to award Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants.
- (c) The Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants awarded under this subchapter shall:
- (1) Not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) per grant;
  - (2) Be limited to thirty (30) one-time grant awards; and
- (3) Be made to a financial institution designated by the local entity that is a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantee and that has accounts insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the National Credit Union Administration.
- (d)(1) A local entity that is a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantee shall:
- (A) Manage the funds it receives for conducting broadband due-diligence business studies; and
- (B) File with the institute an audited accounting of disbursed funds for conducting broadband due-diligence business studies, which shall include information concerning the organizations conducting the broadband due-diligence business studies, the amount paid to those organizations, and the due date of broadband due-diligence business studies.
- (2) The accounting described in subdivision (d)(1)(B) of this section shall be filed no later than:
  - (A)(i) Four (4) months from the date of receipt of the funds.

- (ii) A local entity that files an accounting under subdivision (d)(2)(A)(i) of this section shall file an additional accounting at the conclusion of the broadband due-diligence business study; or

- (a) The General Assembly shall maintain oversight of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Grant Program under this subchapter by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council, or of the Joint Budget Committee if the General Assembly is in session, as provided by law before Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants are awarded.
- (b) The Director of the Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or his or her designee and the Treasurer of State or his or her designee shall:
- (1) <u>Summarize to the General Assembly before Rural</u>

  <u>Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants are awarded; and</u>

(2)(A) File a biannual report detailing:

- (i) The balance of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses
  Trust Fund as of the reporting date;
- (ii) A list of the administrative overhead costs paid for from the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund; and
- (iii) A detailed description of the grant applications received and the amount of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant funds that were disbursed.

(B) The biannual report required under subdivision (b)(2)(A) of this section shall be submitted by January 1 and July 1 of each year to the:

A local entity that is a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantee under this subchapter shall:

- (1) Report to the Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences semiannually about the status of the local entity's broadband due-diligence business study; and
- (2) <u>Cite reports and analyses finalized as a consequence of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant award.</u>

- (a) If an application by a local entity for a federal grant or loan for a broadband development program is made and successfully awarded by the United States Government, then the local entity as grantee shall report and disclose the award received from the United States Government within thirty (30) days of the award notification to the:

- (b)(1) If an award is made by the United States Government, additional funds shall be disbursed to the local entity as a grantee or awardee, as the grantee designates, to initiate the broadband development project.
- (2) The additional awards shall be in the amount of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).
- (3) It is anticipated that funds disbursed under this subsection shall defray expenses related to conclusion of the federal grant or loan, including without limitation the expenses of obtaining a letter of credit, a bankruptcy opinion, or eligible telecommunications carrier application expenses, as required by the federal grant or loan awarded.
- 23-18-1208. Reporting related to commencement of broadband development program funded by federal grant or loan.
- (a) A local entity that has been awarded a federal grant or loan for a broadband development program shall report the status of the broadband development program to the Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences within nine (9) months of the award of the federal grant or loan.

UAMS - ADULT SICKLE CELL DISEASE PROGRAM. There is hereby established a program for the comprehensive care of Adult Sickle Cell Disease to be known as the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Adult Sickle Cell Disease Program. The program will facilitate the continued development of adult sickle cell—disease treatment, preventive—care, education, and training for health care professionals and related personnel utilizing the—University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences' Area Health Education Centers throughout the State and Institute for Digital Health and Innovation. Funding for the Program will be from general revenue and cash funds from fees for services, donations, grants, and federal funds. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences will not assume responsibility for funding the Program until such time as the General Assembly appropriates and funds the Program.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTER GRANTS. The grants authorized in the Domestic Violence Shelter Programs and Grants appropriation section of this act shall be equally distributed to domestic violence shelters as determined by the Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission. The Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission may adopt rules and regulations to carry out the intent of the General Assembly regarding the grant appropriations authorized in the Domestic Violence Shelter Programs and Grants appropriation section of this act.

There is hereby established a center in Arkansas for Dental Education in cooperation with the University of Tennessee Dental School, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and Arkansas Children's Hospital. The Center shall be known as the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Center for Dental Education. The Center will facilitate the continued development of dental education, its specialties and services for the citizens of Arkansas.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2022-2023}{2024}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2023-2024}{2024}$ .

MEDICAL SCHOOL LIMITATION. Nothing in this Act shall create an additional medical school in the State of Arkansas, but it recognizes that appropriations, funding and allocations in this Act may be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences to support satellite campuses or programs outside the City of Little Rock in order to conduct or continue training of its medical, nursing, pharmacy and allied health students, as well as its medical residents.

ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL AND TRANSFER AUTHORIZED. Thirty-three and one-third percent (33-1/3%), in each fiscal year, of the amounts made available to fund the appropriation in the Grants to Children's Hospital, Regular Salaries and Operating Expenses for Indigent Care line item of the Operations appropriation section of this Act shall be distributed to the Arkansas Children's Hospital or Arkansas Children's Hospital may request that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences transfer such funds each fiscal year from the University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund to the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's Hospital.

SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-64-413(b)(2), concerning special allowances for patient care and research faculty, is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts to read as follows: (2) Provided, any such allowance shall not exceed for any employee an amount equal to two (2) two and one-half (2 1/2) times that portion of the salary authorized by the General Assembly to be paid from the University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund.

SPECIAL ALLOWANCES - RECRUITMENT. The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas is hereby authorized to make available to the President of the University of Arkansas special allowances in such amounts as the Board may determine to be justified at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, for the use of the Chancellor and his deans, representatives, department heads, and directors at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in recruitment of faculty and staff members. Upon approval by the President and the Board of Trustees, such funds shall be administered by the Chancellor, who shall assure that the total amount expended for such purposes does not exceed one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) each fiscal year or so much thereof as may be authorized by the Board of Trustees. The funds authorized by this Section shall come from a source other than state tax dollars appropriated by the General Assembly or charges made to students for tuition, fees, room and board, or other purposes. Each year the Chancellor shall furnish to the President of the University of Arkansas, the Board of Trustees, and the Arkansas Legislative Joint Auditing Committee a report showing for each expenditure the date, the amount, the names of persons to whom the expenditure was made, and the purpose for which the expenditure was made. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-64-414, concerning area health education centers, is amended to add an additional subsection to codify special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

- (c)(1) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may utilize appropriated funds for the purpose of contracting with physician-teachers and teachers in other health-related professions residing only at sites located away from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.
- (2) Appropriated funds may be paid only for the purpose of teaching residents and students assigned to area health education centers.
- (3) Contracts entered into with physician teachers, or with teachers in other health-related fields or their associates, require the prior approval of the agency head only and shall be reported quarterly to the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee.

SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 63, Subchapter 3, is amended to add an additional section to codify special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

<u>6-63-317. Overtime, incentives, and differentials for direct and indirect</u> unclassified patient care personnel at University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

- (a) All unclassified positions employed to provide or support patient care at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences are eligible for overtime at the rate of one and one-half (1 1/2) times their regular hourly rate.
- (b) <u>In addition to overtime, unclassified direct and indirect patient</u> care employees scheduled to work shifts outside of normal operating schedules may be eligible to receive up to twenty-four percent (24%) of the hourly rate paid as a shift differential.
- (c)(1) All unclassified positions employed to provide or support patient care at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall be eligible to receive incentive pay not to exceed one and two-tenths (1.2) times their base hourly rate.
- (2) All unclassified employees required to work in specialty areas shall be eligible to receive up to ten percent (10%) of the hourly rate paid as a specialty differential while working in such areas.
- (d)(1) When overtime, shift differentials, standby pay, incentive pay, or specialty differentials are provided to employees as stated in this section, the total may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions.
- (2) This section does not apply to the positions of Patient Care

  Administrator, Associate Administrator, or Assistant Administrator of Patient

  Care.

(e)(1) In addition, the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may also make special compensation allowances available, in such amounts as the board may determine or justify equitable in view of the current requirements for registered nurses in the Clinical Programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the availability of registered nurses for employment in the Little Rock metropolitan area.

(2) However, the special compensation allowances approved by the board for a single individual shall not exceed the state line item maximum by more than twenty percent (20%) for those positions.

#### **CURRENT SPECIAL LANGUAGE (WITH INST. REQUEST)**

#### AR HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

DAY CARE. Of the funds appropriated in the Operations appropriation section of this Act, \$250,000 each year may be allocated as the State's portion of the operating cost of a Child Care Facility of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Individuals using this facility will be charged a daily rate as determined by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2022-2023}{2024}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2023-2024}{2024}$ .

CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the general revenue funds provided by this Act which remains at the close of a fiscal year, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried forward and made available for the same purposes for the next fiscal year.

Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

- (1) Prior to June 30, 2023 2024 the Agency shall by written statement set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

- (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals

These positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of the University during the <del>2022-2023-2023-2024 fiscal year</del> exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to the Arkansas Division of Higher Education for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific positions are requested by the University, recommended by the Arkansas Division of Higher Education, and approved by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

#### AR HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

(b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. # ABUSED CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION.

In the event the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services, these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of Pediatrics.

Trustees of the University of Arkansas may make a special allowance available in an amount the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas determines is justified, which shall be an equitable allowance in light of the unusual and exacting duties of the athletic director, associate or assistant athletic directors, head coaches, and assistant coaches at the campus at Pine Bluff.

- (2) The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas may expend funds from the auxiliary income of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff, which is derived from athletic event receipts, for purposes of allowances made under subdivision (e)(1) of this section.
- (3) However, allowances made under subdivision (e)(1) of this section for the athletic director, associate or assistant athletic directors, head coaches, and assistant coaches at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff shall:
- (A) Be in addition to the regular salary of the athletic director, associate or assistant athletic directors, head coaches, and assistant coaches at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff; and

- (3) If the board uses special allowance funds under subdivision (e)(1) of this section, then the board shall report annually to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee the exact disposition of those allowance funds.
- (f)(1) The board may reimburse tuition, fees, and other education-related expenses of a current university faculty member who seeks additional education levels that will benefit the university in meeting accreditation and professional standards.
- (2) Reimbursement under subdivision (f)(1) of this section shall be authorized only when the reimbursement request submitted by the current university faculty member has been documented by the university to meet critical shortage instructional areas.
