32	WHEREAS, pursuant to Amendment 35 of the Arkansas Constitution, the
33	Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission has the exclusive authority to issue
34	hunting and fishing licenses and permits; and

36	WHEREAS, currently only servicemen and servicewomen permanently

stationed or assigned in Arkansas are granted resident privileges for hunting and fishing in Arkansas. Servicemen and servicewomen who are Arkansas residents at the time of entering service are also granted resident privileges for hunting and fishing, regardless of where they are stationed in the United States; and

WHEREAS, currently any serviceman or servicewomen who comes to Arkansas as a member of the National Guard or any other unit of a reserve component of the armed forces on temporary assignment is not granted resident privileges for hunting and fishing in Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the very valuable service these servicemen and servicewomen provide to the people of this nation, it would be worthy to consider extending resident hunting and fishing privileges to those members of the National Guard or any other unit of a reserve component of the armed forces who are temporarily assigned in this state, even though they are not full-time residents of Arkansas.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the members of the House of Representatives and the Senate respectfully request that the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission consider granting resident hunting and fishing licenses privileges to any person who does not permanently reside in Arkansas but who is a member of the National Guard or any other unit of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States and is temporarily assigned in Arkansas. However, the granting of these privileges should be extended only if the state from which the member is a resident agrees to provide reciprocal privileges for Arkansas servicemen and servicewomen temporarily serving in that state.
