2	As used in this subchapter:
3	(1) "Anatomic pathology services" means:

16	bone marrow aspirates and biopsies performed by a physician or under the

16	(a) A laboratory, a physician, or a practitioner of the healing arts
17	prerforming technical anatomic pathology services for a patient or

22	(2) The patient's insurer or other third-party payor;
