28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-14-102 is amended to read as follows:
29	6-14-102. Annual school election date - Special school election.
30	(a)(1) The annual school election shall be held in each school
31	district of the state on the third <u>Tuesday next after the first Monday</u> in
32	September November.
33	(2) The annual school election shall only concern issues
34	authorized to be on the ballot by the Arkansas Constitution or by statute,
35	and no other issues shall appear on the ballot.
36	(b) The board of directors of any school district shall have the



authority to hold a school election concerning the tax rate or debt issues ona date other than that fixed by law provided that:

3 (1) All constitutional and statutory requirements for the annual
4 school election are met, notwithstanding subdivision (a)(1) of this section;

5 (2) The election is held before the date of the annual school 6 election; and

7 (3) The Commissioner of Education approves the date of the8 election.

9 (c)(1) In any election year, if no more than one (1) candidate for 10 school district director presents a petition or notice in writing to the 11 county board of election commissioners as required by § 6-14-111 and if there 12 are no other ballot issues to be submitted to district electors for 13 consideration, the board of directors of any school district, by resolution 14 duly adopted, may request the county board of election commissioners to 15 reduce the number of polling places or to open no polling places on election 16 day so that the election can be conducted by absentee ballot and early voting 17 only.

(2) If requested by resolution adopted by the board of directors
of any school district, the county board of election commissioners may
provide that no polling places be open on election day so that the election
can be conducted by absentee ballot and early voting only, if:

(A) No more than one (1) candidate for school district
director presents a petition or notice in writing to the county board of
election commissioners as required by § 6-14-111; and

(B) There are no other ballot issues to be submitted todistrict electors for consideration.

(3) In a county that uses voting machines or electronic vote
tabulating devices, the county board of election commissioners may choose to
use paper ballots counted by hand in combination with voting machines
equipped for use by individuals with disabilities.

(d) The board of directors of any school district shall have the
authority to request the county board of election commissioners to call a
special election for the purpose of considering a rate of tax for additional
millages for maintenance and operations or for debt service as authorized by
Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74, provided that:
