35	6-60-601. Selection and use of textbooks and course materials.
36	(a) A state-supported <i>institution of higher education</i> in this state

1	shall establish and implement policies, procedures, and guidelines for the
2	selection and use of textbooks and course materials for undergraduate courses
3	that encourage efforts to minimize the cost of textbooks and course materials
4	for students while maintaining the quality of education and academic freedom.
5	(b) The policies, procedures, and guidelines described in subsection
6	(a) of this section shall require that before the selection of a textbook or
7	course material is finalized, the appropriate faculty member shall:
8	(1) Affirmatively confirm his or her intent to use all items
9	selected, including all items sold as part of a bundled package;
10	(2) Confirm that some components of a bundled package may not be
11	reusable by another student;
12	(3) Affirmatively acknowledge the quoted on-campus retail price
13	for each textbook or course material he or she selects; and
14	(4) Confirm that the publisher of a textbook or course material
15	has acknowledged that all components of a bundled package may be purchased
16	and sold separately by a local textbook retailer.
17	(c) As used in this section, "bundled package" means any combination
18	of one (1) or more reusable textbooks and one (1) or more non-reusable
19	textbooks, workbooks, CD-ROMs, floppy disks, passwords, interactive hand-held
20	remote devices, flash drives, or any other memory-storing device as a package
21	for sale.
