27	As used in this chapter <del>, unless the context otherwise requires</del> :
28	(1) "Analysis" includes physical examination, the use of X-ray
29	and other analytical instruments, and procedures generally used in the
30	practice of chiropractic;
31	(2) "Board" means the Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic
32	Exami ners;
33	(3) "Chiropractic" means that science and art which utilizes the
34	inherent recuperative powers of the body and deals with the relationship
35	between the nervous system and the spinal column, including its immediate
36	articulations, and the role of its relationship in the restoration and

(4) "Chiropractic aide" means an unlicensed member of the
chiropractic team who may assist a chiropractic physician in the performance
of those procedures and techniques constituting the practice of chiropractic
as defined in this chapter with the exception of spinal manipulation and
adjustment, provided that such assistance shall be performed under the direct
supervision of a licensed chiropractic physician;

8 (5) "Physician" means a person authorized or licensed to 9 practice medicine <del>pursuant to</del> <u>under</u> the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, §§ 10 17-95-201 - 17-95-207, 17-95-301 - 17-95-305, and 17-95-401 - 17-95-411, a 11 person authorized or licensed to practice chiropractic <del>pursuant to the</del> 12 <del>provisions of</del> <u>under</u> this chapter, and a person authorized to practice 13 osteopathy <del>pursuant to</del> <u>under</u> § 17-91-101 et seq.;

14 (6)(A)(i) "Practice of chiropractic" means the engagement in the 15 diagnosis and analysis of any interference with normal nerve transmission and 16 expression, focusing on the relationship between structure, primarily the spine, and function, as coordinated by the nervous system, and how that 17 18 relationship affects the preservation and restoration of health, and 19 including the procedure preparatory to and complementary to the correction 20 thereof by an adjustment or manipulation of the articulations of the 21 vertebral column, its immediate articulations, including spinal adjustments, 22 spinal manipulations, and spinal mobilizations, such as any type of pressure, 23 force, thrust, or passive movement, singular or plural, applied to the spinal 24 vertebrae or their adjacent articulations by hand or mechanical device or by 25 other incidental adjustments, for the restoration and maintenance of health.

26 <u>(ii)</u> The practice of chiropractic includes therapy, 27 the normal regimen, and rehabilitation of the patient for the purpose of 28 removing any injury, deformity, or abnormality of human beings without the 29 use of drugs or surgery.

30 (B)(i) The practice of chiropractic, as authorized under 31 the provisions of this chapter, shall not include the performance of the 32 duties of a midwife or obstetrician, therapy by the use of ionizing 33 radiation, incisive surgery, prescribing for or administering to any person 34 any drug to be taken internally, or puncturing the skin for the purpose of 35 introducing any substance into the body.

28	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-81-303, concerning unlawful practice of
29	chiropractic, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows:
30	<u>(e) A violation of § 17-81-102(7) is an unlawful practice of</u>
31	<u>chiropractic and is grounds for the offending health care provider's</u>
32	<u>licensing board to suspend, revoke or refuse to renew the health care</u>
33	provider's license or for other disciplinary action allowed by law.
