24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 7-6-102(a), concerning the political
25	practices pledge, is amended to read as follows:
26	(a)(1) Candidates Except as provided in subdivision (a)(7) of this
27	section, candidates for state or district offices shall file with the
28	Secretary of State and candidates for county, municipal, or township offices
29	shall file with the county clerk of the county not later than 12:00 noon
30	fourteen (14) days after the third Tuesday in March, before the preferential
31	primary election, a pledge in writing stating that they are familiar with the
32	requirements of §§ 7-1-103, 7-1-104, 7-3-108, and 7-6-101 — 7-6-104 and will,

- political practices pledges with the county clerk not fewer than ninety (90) calendar days before the general election by 12:00 noon.
- (4) Persons who wish to be write-in candidates shall file the political practices pledge at the time of filing the notice to be a write-in candidate. A write-in candidate shall file the political practices pledge with the Secretary of State if a candidate for a state or district office or with the county clerk if a candidate for a county, township, or municipal office.
- (5) Nonpartisan judicial candidates paying filing fees in accordance with § 7-10-103(b) shall file the political practices pledge at the time of filing for office.
  - (6) Nonpartisan judicial candidates filing by petition in accordance with § 7-10-103(c) shall file the political practices pledge at the time of filing the petition.
- (7) An incumbent seeking reelection to his or her current office shall file the political practices pledge during regular office hours beginning at 12:00 noon on the second Tuesday in March and ending at 12:00 noon on the fourteenth day thereafter before the preferential primary election.

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-7-203(c), concerning filing deadlines, is amended to read as follows:
- (c)(1) Party Except as provided in subdivision (c)(6) of this section, party pledges, if any, shall be filed with the county clerk or the Secretary of State, as the case may be, and any filing fees of a political party, if any, shall be paid during regular office hours in the period beginning at 12:00 noon on the third Tuesday in March and ending at 12:00 noon on the fourteenth day thereafter before the preferential primary election.
- (2) A Except as provided in subdivision (c)(6) of this section, a party certificate and the political practice practices pledge for primary elections shall be filed with the county clerk or the Secretary of State, as the case may be, during regular office hours in the period beginning at 12:00 noon on the third Tuesday in March and ending at 12:00 noon on the fourteenth day thereafter before the preferential primary election.
- (3) The name of a candidate who fails to file a party certificate by the filing deadline with the Secretary of State or county
