1	INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-179

3	REQUESTING THAT THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY THE
4	RAMIFICATIONS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ENACTING
5	LEGISLATION PERMITTING ANY CITIZEN TO OBTAIN A SECURITY
6	FREEZE UPON THE USE OF THE CITIZEN'S CREDIT INFORMATION.
7	
8	WHEREAS, numerous states have enacted "security freeze" legislation that
9	enables a citizen of the state to prevent access to the citizen's credit information as a tool
10	to prevent identity theft and related crimes and for the protection of individual citizens;
11	and
12	
13	WHEREAS, the overwhelming majority of states do not require a citizen to
14	become an actual victim of identity theft before permitting a security freeze to be placed
15	upon releasing the citizen's credit information; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, the security freeze legislation enacted by the Eighty-Sixth General
18	Assembly, Act 391 of 2007, limits the ability to obtain a security freeze to cases in which
19	a citizen has been an actual victim of identity theft, thereby offering no protection to a
20	citizen whose personal or financial information is lost, misplaced, or stolen against
21	becoming an actual victim of identity theft; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, the General Assembly should do as much as it can to prevent the
24	ability to commit identity theft crimes and to protect its citizens from becoming victims
25	of identity theft,
26	
27	NOW THEREFORE,
28	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL:
29	
30	THAT the Legislative Council study the ramifications of the General Assembly
31	enacting legislation permitting any citizen to obtain a security freeze upon the use of the
32	citizen's credit information.
