1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-205 2 REQUESTING THE HOUSE AND SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEES ON EDUCATION 3 4 REVIEW THE ADEQUACY OF EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS PROVIDED IN THE STATE'S JUVENILE DETENTION CENTERS. 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the Arkansas Constitution mandates that the General Assembly 8 ensure that all public school students receive an adequate education; and 9 10 WHEREAS, public school students who are detained in juvenile detention 11 centers have special social and educational needs; and 12 13 WHEREAS, it is critical to the health, welfare, and safety of the 14 citizens of Arkansas that students in juvenile detention centers receive the 15 same educational opportunities as students in regular public schools, 16 17 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE AND SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION OF THE 18 19 EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 20 21 THAT the House Interim Committee on Education, joined by the Senate 22 Interim Committee on Education, review the system of public education 23 provided to students in juvenile detention centers in Arkansas, including: 24 Whether students receive the same educational opportunities 1) 25 needed to receive an adequate education as students in regular public 26 schools; 27 2) Whether educational programs in juvenile detention centers follow 28 the same educational standards as regular public schools; 29 Whether juvenile detention centers recruit and retain qualified 3) 30 teachers and whether ineligibility for the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System impacts the availability of quality teachers in these programs; 31 Whether educational programs in juvenile detention centers are 32 4) 33 evaluated by and accountable to the Department of Education through (a) 34 school improvement plans (ACSIP), and (b) accessibility and use of statewide 35 assessments, and accountability and reporting systems (APSCN); 36 5) Whether students receive the same social services and assessment
