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9	WHEREAS, the Children's Behavioral Health Care Commission, having
10	worked for just one (1) year, is only now beginning to get a grasp on the
11	many issues facing mental health services for children across Arkansas; and
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13	WHEREAS, the commission's primary concerns involve quality,
14	consistency, service availability, and additional services that should be
15	included under Arkansas's Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Mental
16	Illness; and
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18	WHEREAS, additional services that the commission has identified for
19	consideration include:
20	Telemedicine reimbursement for the under twenty-on (21) population;
21	Substance abuse reimbursement through Rehabilitation Services for
22	Persons with Mental Illness; and
23	Specialized care; and
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25	WHEREAS, disparities in reimbursement among Rehabilitation Services for
26	Persons with Mental Illness programs threaten to disrupt services; and
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28	WHEREAS, a flood of new applications for certification as
29	Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Mental Illness providers have been
30	submitted to the Division of Behavioral Health, many of the applications
31	coming from agencies and facilities that already receive reimbursement
32	through the State of Arkansas, but under different licenses, for instance,
33	through the Division of Youth Services, the Office of Alcohol and Drug Abuse
34	Prevention, and the Department of Community Correction; and
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36	WHEREAS, these disparate applications raise concerns for the future

1 health of the statewide system, including (1) funding, shortages of mental 2 health professionals, service saturation in some locations with resulting 3 service shortages in other locations, (2) concerns that the creation of many 4 new provider programs will outpace the System of Care implementation plan 5 approved by the Commission, and (3) that the state's ability to manage and 6 monitor programs will be impaired in the face of the dramatic increase in 7 applications and providers; and 8 9 WHEREAS, unlike the Certificate of Need methodology, there is no 10 formula to determine the appropriate level of services necessary to maximize 11 supply and demand for Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Mental 12 Illness; and 13 14 WHEREAS, a study should be conducted to consider an immediate freeze on 15 approval of any pending Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Mental 16 Illness Certification Applications; and 17 WHEREAS, this modified moratorium can also be the gatekeeper to ensure 18 19 that funding is secured and managed as necessary to properly treat this critical population of children; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the interim study can be a guide to managing the 23 Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Mental Illness provider pool to 24 ensure that services are available in the underserved areas of the state, 25 26 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH 27 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 28 29 30 THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council of the Eighty-Sixth Arkansas 31 General Assembly refer to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Public 32 Health, Welfare, and Labor a study of the programs, funding, and 33 certification policies regarding Rehabilitation Services for Persons with 34 Mental Illness. 35
