19	TO EXCLUDE FROM THE ARKANSAS VETERINARY
20	PRACTICE ACT THE SERVICES OF ANIMAL
21	HUSBANDRY AND TO ALLOW THE PRACTICE OF
22	ACUPUNCTURE, CHIROPRACTIC, AND DENTISTRY
23	ON VARIOUS FARM ANIMALS UNDER THE
24	SUPERVISION OF A VETERINARIAN.
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27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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29	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-101-102, concerning the definitions for
30	veterinary medicine, is amended to add additional definitions as follows:
31	(15) "Animal husbandry" means the branch of agriculture and
32	animal science specifically related to the care, breeding, management, and
33	marketing of bovine, caprine, equine, porcine, poultry, and other farm
34	animals; and

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1	(16)(A) "Teeth floating" means a husbandry procedure distinct
2	from veterinary dentistry and includes the following procedures preformed on
3	bovine, equine, porcine, and other farm animals:
4	(i) The removal of enamel points;
5	(ii) The smoothing, contouring, and leveling of
6	dental arcades and incisors; and
7	(iii) The extraction of deciduous and vestigial
8	teeth.
9	(B) "Teeth floating" does not include:
10	(i) The administration of sedatives to any animal;
11	or
12	(ii) Dental procedures on canines or felines.
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14	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-101-307(b), concerning the practices
15	that are excluded from the practice of veterinary medicine, is amended to
16	read as follows:
17	(b) This chapter shall not be construed to prohibit:
18	(1) Employees of the federal or state government or employees of
19	local government who are certified by an agency approved by the board to
20	perform euthanasia from performing their official duties;
21	(2) Regular students in a veterinary school or college from
22	performing duties or actions assigned by the school or college or working
23	under the direct personal supervision of a veterinarian licensed in the State
24	of Arkansas;
25	(3) Reciprocal aid of neighbors in performing routine accepted
26	livestock management practices without compensation;
27	(4) Any veterinarian licensed in any foreign jurisdiction from
28	consulting with a licensed veterinarian;
29	(5) The owner of an animal, his or her consignees, and their
30	employees from performing routine accepted livestock management practices in
31	the care of animals belonging to the owner;
32	(6) Animal husbandry acts and routine accepted livestock
33	management practices performed for compensation including without limitation
34	the following:
35	(A) Branding;
36	(B) Castrating;

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1	(C) Dehorning;
2	(D) Deworming;
3	(E) Ear notching;
4	(F) Tail docking;
5	(G) Teeth floating;
6	(H) Farriery and hoof care;
7	(I) Massage;
8	(J) Pregnancy checking;
9	(K) Collecting, preparing, or freezing semen;
10	(L) Artificial insemination;
11	(M) Training;
12	(N) Vaccinating; and
13	(0) The acts of a person advising with respect to
14	nutrition, feeds, or feeding;
15	(6)(7) A member of the faculty of a veterinary school from
16	performing his or her regular functions or a person from lecturing or giving
17	instruction or demonstration at a veterinary school or in connection with a
18	continuing education course or seminar for licensed veterinarians or
19	registered technicians;
20	(7)(8) A person from engaging in bona fide scientific research
21	which reasonably requires experimentation involving animals;
22	(8)(A)(9)(A) Any act, task, or function performed by a
23	veterinary technician at the direction of and under the supervision of a
24	licensed veterinarian, when:
25	(i) The technician is certified by and annually
26	registered with the board as one qualified by training or experience to
27	function as an assistant to a veterinarian;
28	(ii) The act, task, or function is performed at the
29	direction of, and under the supervision of, a licensed veterinarian in
30	accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the board; and
31	(iii) The services of the veterinary technician are
32	limited to assisting the veterinarian in the particular fields for which the
33	assistant has been trained, certified, and registered.
34	(B) Subdivision (b)(8)(A) <u>(b)(9)(A)</u> of this section shall
35	not limit or prevent any veterinarian from delegating to a qualified person

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1	any acts, tasks, or functions which are otherwise permitted by law but which
2	do not include diagnosis, prescribing medication, or surgery; or
3	(9)(10)(A) Any chiropractor licensed in this state and certified
4	by the American Veterinary Chiropractic Association from performing
5	chiropractic upon animals so long as the chiropractic is performed under the
6	immediate supervision of an Arkansas-licensed veterinarian.
7	(B)(i) Any practitioner of acupuncture, chiropractic, or
8	veterinary dentistry from performing the practitioner's procedures on bovine,
9	equine, porcine, and other farm animals so long as the procedure is performed
10	under the immediate supervision of an Arkansas-licensed veterinarian.
11	(ii) The exemption provided in subdivision
12	(10)(B)(i) of this subsection does not include the administration of
13	sedatives to any animal or acupuncture, chiropractic, and veterinary
14	dentistry on canines or felines.
