3	REQUESTING THE INTERIM SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE
4	AND LABOR AND THE INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH,
5	WELFARE AND LABOR TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF CREATING A PROGRAM
6	TO MAKE MEDICAL MARIJUANA AVAILABLE TO ARKANSANS SUFFERING FROM
7	DEBILITATING MEDICAL CONDITIONS.
8	
9	WHEREAS, Arkansans suffering from debilitating medical conditions and
10	their physicians have found marijuana to be an effective treatment for
11	suffering caused by debilitating medical conditions and therefore, marijuana
12	should be treated like other medicines; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, Debilitating medical conditions that can eased by the medical
15	use of marijuana include cancer, glaucoma, positive status for HIV/AIDS and
16	treatment for these conditions, cachexia, persistent muscle spasms, including
17	spasms caused by multiple sclerosis, seizures, including seizures caused by
18	epilepsy, severe nausea, including nausea caused by medications necessary for
19	the treatment of life-threatening diseases, and severe pain; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, Arkansans suffering from debilitating medical conditions
22	should be allowed to use small amounts of marijuana without fear of civil or
23	criminal penalties when their physicians advise that the use of small amounts
24	marijuana of may provide a medical benefit to the sufferer when other
25	reasonable restrictions are met regarding that use; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, the General Assembly should make only those changes to
28	existing Arkansas laws that are necessary to protect patients and their
29	doctors from criminal and civil penalties related to the medical use of
30	marijuana; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, the Department of Health should establish and maintain a
33	program to strictly control:
34	(1) the production and distribution of medical marijuana;
35	(2) the individuals authorized to possess medical marijuana
36	through a registration program;

(3) the amounts of medical marijuana that an individual may possess; and WHEREAS, the quality of life for many Arkansans suffering from debilitating medical conditions and for the families of those suffering Arkansans would be significantly improved if the benefits of medical marijuana become available in Arkansas, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR AND THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR OF THE ARKANSAS GENERAL ASSEMBLY: THAT the Senate Committee On Public Health, Welfare, And Labor And The House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, And Labor study the feasibility of creating a program to make medical marijuana available to Arkansans suffering from debilitating medical conditions.
