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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-28-202 is amended to read as	follows:
22	17-28-202. Duties of board <u>Board of Electrical Examiners of</u>	the State
23	of Arkansas and Department of Labor.	
24	(a) It shall be the duty of the Board of Electrical Examine	rs of the
25	State of Arkansas to:	
26	(1) Adopt rules and regulations necessary for the imp	lementation
27	of this chapter and § 17-55-101 et seq.;	
28	(2) At least every six (6) months, conduct examination	ns of
29	persons who apply for an electrician's license and grant licenses	to
30	qualifying applicants who have paid the prescribed fee; and	
31	(3) Grant licenses to qualifying applicants for an el	<u>ectrical</u>
32	inspector's license under § 17-55-101 et seq.; and	
33	(3)(4) Revoke or suspend the license of any licensee	or the
34	certification of any electrical apprentice for cause.	
35	(b)(l) It shall be the duty of the Department of Labor to a	dminister
36	and enforce the provisions of this chapter.	

1 (2) For the enforcement of this chapter, the Director of the 2 Department of Labor or his or her designated employees shall have the authority to enter, during normal business hours, upon any private or public 3 4 premises with right of access, ingress, and egress for the purpose of 5 ascertaining whether a person has performed electrical work or installed or 6 repaired electrical facilities thereon in accordance with the provisions of 7 this chapter, § 20-31-101 et seq., and the regulations and standards adopted 8 pursuant thereto. 9 10 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-28-301(b), concerning the expiration and renewal of electrician's licenses, is amended to add an additional 11 12 subdivision to read as follows: (6) If a person simultaneously holds an electrical inspector 13 14 license and a license as a master electrician or a journeyman electrician, the person, when renewing his or her master electrician or journeyman 15 electrician license, shall be exempt from the: 16 17 (1) Renewal fee under this section; and 18 (2) Continuing education requirements for master 19 electricians and journeyman electricians under § 17-28-311. 20 21 22 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-28-305 is amended to read as follows: 23 17-28-305. Local regulatory authority - Exceptions - Electrical 24 inspectors. 25 (a) Any individual licensed or registered under the provisions of this 26 chapter shall not be subject to examination or licensing by any city or 27 county in order to perform electrical work. (b) Any city or town may by ordinance, rules, regulations, or contract 28 29 prescribe rules, regulations, and standards for the materials used in the 30 construction, installation, and inspection of all electrical work in the city or county, provided the rules, regulations, or standards are not in conflict 31 32 with the standards prescribed by the Board of Electrical Examiners of the State of Arkansas pursuant to under the authority of §§ § 17-28-202, § 17-55-33 34 101 et seq., and § 20-31-104. Provided, that a city or county may by ordinance require a person, before doing electrical work on his or her 35 36 primary residence, to demonstrate a technical competency to comply with the

1 city or county standards. If the city has adopted an ordinance to exercise 2 its territorial planning jurisdiction and if the city and county agree to authorize such, a city may exercise jurisdiction over the construction, 3 4 installation, and inspection of electrical work within the city's territorial 5 jurisdiction for planning authorized under § 14-56-413. 6 (c) Any city or county may establish by ordinance, rules, and 7 regulations a system of permits and inspections for the installation, repair, and maintenance of electrical facilities and electrical work. 8 9 (d) An electrical inspector shall be licensed by the Board of Electrical Examiners of the State of Arkansas under § 17-55-101 et seq. 10 11 12 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add an additional chapter to read as follows: 13 14 Chapter 55 Electrical Inspectors 15 16 17 17-55-101. Licensure of electrical inspectors. 18 (a) A person employed as an electrical inspector in the State of 19 Arkansas shall hold an electrical inspector license issued by the Board of 20 Electrical Examiners of the State of Arkansas. (b)(1) A person shall apply for licensure as an electrical inspector 21 22 on a form approved by the Board of Electrical Examiners of the State of 23 Arkansas within thirty (30) days of employment as an electrical inspector. (2) Applications shall be made to the board and shall contain: 24 25 (A) Proof of employment with the state or a political 26 subdivision of the state as an electrical inspector in the State of Arkansas; 27 (B)(i) Verification of work experience as required by rule 28 of the board. 29 (ii) Work experience shall include without 30 <u>limitation demonstrated knowledge of:</u> 31 (a) The standard materials and methods used in 32 the installation of electric equipment; 33 (b) Approved methods of construction to ensure 34 the safety of persons and property; and

1	(c) The requirements of the statewide
2	standards for the construction, installation, and maintenance of electrical
3	facilities and the performance of electrical work under § 20-31-104; and
4	(C) Payment of a license fee as established by rule of the
5	board that shall not exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
6	(c) An electrical inspector license:
7	(1) Shall expire on January 1 of each year; and
8	(2) May be renewed upon application to the board and submission
9	of the following information:
10	(A) Proof of continued employment as an electrical
11	inspector in the State of Arkansas;
12	(B) Payment of a license fee as established by rule of the
13	board that shall not exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00); and
14	(C)(i) Proof of completion of at least sixteen (16) hours
15	of continuing education.
16	(ii) The board shall promulgate rules to set
17	standards for continuing education for licensees under subdivision
18	(c)(l)(C)(i) of this section. The rules shall include without limitation
19	continuing education on the statewide standards for the construction,
20	installation, and maintenance of electrical facilities and the performance of
21	electrical work under § 20-31-104.
22	(d) The board may revoke or suspend an electrical inspector's license
23	for just cause.
24	(e) If a person simultaneously holds an electrical inspector license
25	and a license as a master electrician or a journeyman electrician, the
26	person, when renewing his or her master electrician or journeyman electrician
27	license, shall be exempt from the:
28	(1) Renewal fee under § 17-28-301; and
29	(2) Continuing education requirements for master electricians
30	and journeyman electricians under § 17-28-311.
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32	17-55-102. Provisions applicable to electrical inspectors.
33	(a)(1) Licensure as an electrical inspector does not qualify a person
34	to act as an electrician under § 17-28-101 et seq.

1	(2)(A) This chapter shall not require an individual to hold a			
2	license before doing electrical work on his or her primary residence except			
3	as otherwise required by state law, regulations, or local ordinances.			
4	(B) The exemption from compliance with the licensing			
5	standards shall not be referred to in any way and shall not be evidence of			
6	the lack of negligence or the exercise of due care by a party at a trial of			
7	any civil action to recover damages by any party.			
8	(b) A person licensed as an electrical inspector under this chapter			
9	shall not inspect electrical work that he or she:			
10	(1) Installed; or			
11	(2) Supervised.			
12	(c)(1) Except as provided in subdivisions (c)(2) and (c)(3) of this			
13	section, a person licensed as an electrical inspector shall conduct			
14	inspections only within the political subdivision employing the inspector.			
15	(2) If a person licensed as an electrical inspector is employed			
16	by more than one (1) political subdivision, he or she may conduct inspections			
17	within any of the political subdivisions employing the person as an			
18	electrical inspector.			
19	(3) A person employed by the state as an electrical inspector			
20	may conduct inspections anywhere within the State of Arkansas.			
21	(d) This act shall not prohibit a person licensed as an electrical			
22	inspector or an electrician from performing work free of charge on his or her			
23	own properties, properties of family members, or for a non-profit charity if			
24	the person holds the requisite license for the work performed free of charge.			
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26	17-55-103. Persons employed as electrical inspectors as of the			
27	effective date of this act.			
28	(a) A person employed as an electrical inspector as of the effective			
29	date of this act shall be issued a temporary electrical inspector license			
30	upon submission of the following information to the Board of Electrical			
31	Examiners of the State of Arkansas:			
32	(1) Proof of employment with the state or a political			
33	subdivision of the state as an electrical inspector in the State of Arkansas.			
34	(2) Verification of work experience as required by rule of the			
35	board; and			
36	(3) Payment of a license fee as required by rule of the board.			

1	(b)(1) A temporary license issued under this section shall expire on
2	January 1, 2012.
3	(2) A recipient of a temporary license shall be eligible to
4	apply for an electrical inspector license under this section.
