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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 11-9-113 is amended to read as follows:
26	11-9-113. Mental injury or illness.
27	(a)(1) As used in this section, "emergency responder" means a
28	compensated person or volunteer who:
29	(A) Responds to the scene of a disaster or an emergency;
30	<u>and</u>
31	(B) Is acting in an assigned role in public safety and
32	emergency services.
33	(2) "Emergency responder" may include without limitation:
34	(A) Law enforcement officers;
35	(B) Firefighters;
36	(C) Emergency management personnel;

1	(D) Emergency medical personnel; and
2	(E) Emergency service personnel.
3	(b)(1) A mental injury or illness is not a compensable injury unless
4	it is caused by physical injury to the employee's body, and shall not be
5	considered an injury arising out of and in the course of employment or
6	compensable unless it is demonstrated by a preponderance of the evidence;
7	provided, however, that this physical injury limitation shall not apply to
8	any victim of a crime of violence or to an emergency responder.
9	(2) No mental injury or illness under this section shall be
10	compensable unless it is also diagnosed by a licensed psychiatrist or
11	psychologist and unless the diagnosis of the condition meets the criteria
12	established in the most current issue of the Diagnostic and Statistical
13	Manual of Mental Disorders.
14	$\frac{(b)(1)(c)(1)}{(c)(1)}$ Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
15	where a claim is by reason of for mental injury or illness, the employee
16	shall be is limited to twenty-six (26) fifty-two (52) weeks of disability
17	benefits.
18	(2)(A) $\frac{\text{In case}}{\text{If}}$ death results directly from the mental injury
19	or illness within a period of one (1) year $\underline{\text{from the time compensation was}}$
20	last paid or two (2) years from the date of injury, whichever is longer,
21	compensation shall be paid $\underline{\text{to}}$ the dependents as provided in other death cases
22	under this chapter.
23	(B) <u>Unless the decedent is an emergency responder</u> , Death
24	<u>death</u> directly or indirectly related to the mental injury or illness
25	occurring one (1) year or more from the incident resulting in the mental
26	injury or illness shall not be a compensable injury.
