17	TO ENSURE THAT SCHOOL DISTRICTS BELOW A
18	SPECIFIC STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT LEVEL USE
19	PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING TO IMPROVE STUDENT
20	ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § $6-20-2202(d)(1)(A)(ii)$, concerning the
26	budget and expenditure report, is amended to read as follows:
27	(ii)(a) Information on fund balances maintained by
28	the school district, open-enrollment public charter school, or education
29	service cooperative, including, but not limited to, including without
30	<u>limitation</u> the:
31	(1) Sources of the funds maintained as
32	fund balances, to the extent practicable including without limitation
33	foundation funding as defined under § 6-20-2308;
34	(2) Reasons for maintaining, instead of
35	spending, the fund balances;

1	(3)(A) Amount of funds transferred
2	between various funds during the past year.
3	(B) The school district, open-
4	enrollment public charter school, and education service cooperative shall
5	identify the funds transferred between <u>various funds</u> and the amount of funds
6	transferred; and
7	(4) Amount of fund balances dedicated
8	for the construction, maintenance, or repair of academic or athletic
9	facilities.
10	(b) The Department of Education shall
11	promulgate rules that require reporting of fund balances sufficient for an
12	auditor to verify whether funds allocated for educational purposes,
13	including, but not limited to, including without limitation student academic
14	needs and the maintenance and operation of public school district facilities,
15	are used for their intended purposes or retained by the school district in
16	its fund balances.
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18	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 20, Subchapter 23 is amended
19	to add an additional section to read as follows:
20	6-20-2308. School district use of foundation funding.
21	(a) As used in this section:
22	(1) "Foundation funding" means the amount of funding a school
23	district is required to spend to provide an adequate education for its
24	students in a school year calculated as the per-student foundation funding
25	amount under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) multiplied by the three quarter average daily
26	membership of a school district for the previous year;
27	(2) "Foundation funding carry-forward" means the amount of
28	foundation funding carried forward from the immediately preceding school
29	<u>year; and</u>
30	(3) "Student achievement criteria" means the criteria
31	established by the State Board of Education consisting of one (1) or more
32	indicators of student growth and achievement to determine the level at which
33	a school district or public charter school is subject to a restriction on
34	spending foundation funding and foundation funding carry-forward.
35	(b)(l) A school district or public charter school shall maintain
36	foundation funding and foundation funding carry-forward in a designated fund

1	that does not include funding from any other source of revenue, as
2	established by state board rules.
3	(2) The amount of a school district's foundation funding carry-
4	forward existing on June 30, 2011, shall be placed in the designated fund for
5	foundation funding and foundation funding carry-forward.
6	(c) By September 1, 2011, the State Board of Education shall establish
7	by rule the student achievement criteria.
8	(d)(1) Beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, the Department of
9	Education shall annually identify at which of the following levels a school
10	district or public charter school meets the student achievement criteria:
11	(A) Eighty percent (80%) or more of the school district's
12	or public charter school's students meet the student achievement criteria;
13	(B) Sixty-five percent (65%) or more but less than eighty
14	percent (80%) of the school district's or public charter school's students
15	meet the student achievement criteria;
16	(C) More than fifty percent (50%) but less than sixty-five
17	percent (65%) of the school district's or public charter school's students
18	meet the student achievement criteria; or
19	(D) Fifty percent (50%) or less of the school district's
20	or public charter school's students meet the student achievement criteria.
21	(2) A school district at the level under:
22	(A) Subdivision (d)1)(A) of this section is not restricted
23	on spending foundation funding and foundation funding carry-forward.
24	(B) Subdivision (d)1)(B) of this section shall spend
25	during the school year all foundation funding and foundation funding carry-
26	forward to provide an adequate education to its students;
27	(C)(1) Subdivision $(d)(1)(C)$ of this section shall spend
28	all foundation funding and foundation funding carry-forward under the
29	guidance of the department.
30	(2) All spending under this subdivision (d)(2)(C)
31	shall be directed to implement evidence-based programs designed to improve
32	student achievement that may include without limitation after-school programs
33	and tutoring; and
34	(D)(i) Subdivision $(d)(1)(D)$ of this section shall be
35	identified as being in academic distress, fiscal distress, or both by the
36	department; and

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
