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## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF A SELF-SERVICE DISPLAY
TO SELL LOTTERY TICKETS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 23-115-103(23 -- (26), concerning definitions relating to the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery Act, are amended to read as follows:
(23)(A) "Self-service display" means a display:
(i) That contains a ticket or share;
(ii) That is located in an area where the customers of a retailer are permitted; and
(iii) In which the lottery ticket or share can be purchased by a customer without the assistance of an employee of the retailer.
(B) "Self-service display" includes without limitation a vending machine.
(24) "Share" means any intangible evidence of participation in a lottery;
(24)(25) "Ticket" means any tangible evidence issued by a lottery to provide participation in a lottery;
(25)(A)(26)(A) "Vendor" means a person who provides or proposes to provide goods or services to the Arkansas Lottery Commission under a major procurement contract.
(B) "Vendor" does not include:
(i) An employee of the Arkansas Lottery Commission;
(ii) A retailer; or
(iii) A state agency or instrumentality.
(C) "Vendor" includes a corporation whose stock is publicly traded and that is the parent company of the contracting party in a major procurement contract; and
(26)(27) "Video lottery" means a lottery game that allows a game to be played using an electronic computer and an interactive computer terminal device:
(A) That is equipped with a video screen and keys and a keyboard or other equipment allowing input by an individual player;
(B) Into which the player inserts coins, currency, vouchers, or tokens as consideration in order for play to be available; and
(C) Through which the player may receive free games, coins, tokens, or credits that may be redeemed for cash, annuitized payments over time, a noncash prize, or nothing, as may be determined wholly or predominantly by chance.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 23-115-207(a)(9), concerning the rulemaking authority of the Arkansas Lottery Commission, is amended to read as follows: (9)(A) The method to be used in selling tickets or shares.
(B) The selling of tickets or shares may include the use of electronic or mechanical devices. shall not be made through the use of a self-service display;
(C) If the commission elects to use electronic of
mechanical devices to sell tickets or shares, the commission shall provide by rule:
(i) Specifications and required features for
electronic or mechanical devices that may be used to sell tickets or shares; and
(ii) Procedures and requirements to prevent the use of electronic or mechanical devices by an individual under eighteen (18) years of age.
(D) A retailer who knowingly allows a person under eighteen (18) years of age to purchase a lotery ticket from an electronic or mechanical device is subject to the penalties under § 23-115-901;
