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     Retirement & Social Security Programs study the number of members of the
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     Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System entitled to a waiver of the

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     social, and other effects of waivers under Act 657 of 2009;
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           BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim Joint Committee On Public
     Retirement & Social Security Programs study the number of public employees
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     that have retired under the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System and
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     returned to work for the state since Act 657 of 2009 was enacted and the
     economic, social, and other effects of permitting this activity; and
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           BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim Joint Committee On Public
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     Retirement & Social Security Programs study the feasibility and effectiveness
     of legislation requiring state agencies to notify the legislature when an
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     agency director or deputy director retires.
