17	CONCERNING THE MANDATORY LOSS OF
18	RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR MEMBERS OF THE
19	ARKANSAS JUDICIAL RETIREMENT SYSTEM WHO
20	SEEK OFFICE AFTER REACHING SEVENTY (70)
21	YEARS OF AGE.

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
25	
26	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-8-101(a), concerning a previously
27	retired justice, is amended to read as follows:
28	(a) Any \underline{A} judge or justice under the age of seventy (70) who is
29	receiving retirement benefits under 24-8-201 et seq. or 24-8-701 et seq.,
30	who is elected or appointed to any judicial office in this state, and who
31	foregoes receipt of retirement benefits while serving in the judicial office
32	shall be entitled to resume receiving his or her previous retirement benefits
33	upon termination of the subsequent service.
34	
35	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-8-215(c), concerning eligibility for
36	benefits and retirement generally, is repealed.

1 (c)(1) Any judge or justice who becomes seventy (70) years of age 2 during a term of office to which he has been elected may complete the term 3 without forfeiting his rights to retirement benefits under this section. 4 (2)(A) Any judge or justice who is not eligible to retire at age 5 seventy (70) may continue to serve as judge until the completion of the term 6 of office in which he receives sufficient credited service to retire without 7 losing his retirement benefits. 8 (B) The judge or justice shall lose all retirement 9 benefits if he serves beyond the end of the term needed to get sufficient 10 credited service to retire. 11 (3)(A) Otherwise, judges or justices must retire by their seventieth birthday or lose their retirement benefits. 12 13 (B) However, any active judge or justice who was serving 14 prior to July 1, 1965, may continue to serve until any age and shall, upon retirement, be eligible to receive retirement benefits. 15 16 17 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-8-218(c)(4)(A), concerning retirement 18 and survivors' benefits generally, is amended to read as follows: 19 (4)(A) Any \underline{A} judge or justice under the age of seventy (70) who is receiving retirement benefits under this subchapter or § 24-8-701 et seq. 20 21 and who is elected or appointed to any judicial office in this state and who 22 foregoes receipt of retirement benefits while serving in the judicial office 23 shall be entitled to resume receiving his or her previous retirement benefits 24 upon termination of the subsequent service. 25 26 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-8-224 is repealed. 27 24-8-224. Benefits when serving past mandatory retirement age. (a) Notwithstanding § 24-8-215 regarding mandatory retirement under 28 29 the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System for any judge or justice upon 30 reaching seventy (70) years of age or any other law to the contrary, any judge or justice covered under the system who served continuously for at 31 32 least sixteen (16) years, who is at least eighty (80) years of age, who is not serving on April 19, 1995, and who is ineligible for retirement due to 33 34 having served beyond the mandatory retirement age shall be entitled to 35 receive retirement benefits under the system.

1	(b) Retirement benefits under this section shall be retroactive to
2	January 1, 1995, or, for judges or justices retiring after 1995, to January 1
3	of the year of retirement.
4	
5	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 24-8-710(b), concerning eligibility for
6	benefits and retirement generally, is repealed.
7	(b)(1) Any judge or justice who becomes seventy (70) years of age
8	during a term of office to which he or she has been elected may complete the
9	term without forfeiting his or her rights to retirement benefits under this
10	section.
11	(2)(A) Any judge or justice who is not eligible to retire at age
12	seventy (70) may continue to serve as judge or justice until the completion
13	of the term of office in which he or she has sufficient service to retire
14	without losing his or her retirement benefits.
15	(B) The judge or justice shall lose all retirement
16	benefits if he or she serves beyond the end of the term needed to get
17	sufficient service to retire.
18	(3)(A) Otherwise, judges or justices must retire by their
19	seventieth birthday or lose their retirement benefits.
20	(B) However, any active judge or justice who was serving
21	prior to July 1, 1965, may continue to serve until any age and upon
22	retirement shall be eligible to receive retirement benefits.
