18	CONCERNING SCHOOL SECURITY AND SCHOOL
19	CRISIS RESPONSE TRAINING; TO DECLARE AN
20	EMERGENCY.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-73-119(e), concerning defenses to
26	carrying a handgun or firearm on school property, is amended to read as
27	follows:
28	(e) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that at the time
29	of the act of possessing a handgun or firearm:
30	(1) The person is in his or her own dwelling or place of
31	business or on property in which he or she has a possessory or proprietary
32	interest, except upon the property of a public or private institution of
33	higher learning;
34	(2) The person is a law enforcement officer, correctional
35	officer, or member of the armed forces acting in the course and scope of his
36	or her official duties;

1	(3) The person is assisting a law enforcement officer,
2	correctional officer, or member of the armed forces acting in the course and
3	scope of his or her official duties pursuant to the direction or request of
4	the law enforcement officer, correctional officer, or member of the armed
5	forces;
6	(4) The person is a licensed security guard acting in the course
7	and scope of his or her duties;
8	(5) The person is hunting game with a handgun or firearm that
9	may be hunted with a handgun or firearm under the rules and regulations of
10	the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission or is en route to or from a
11	hunting area for the purpose of hunting game with a handgun or firearm;
12	(6) The person is a certified law enforcement officer;
13	(7) The person is on a journey, unless the person is eighteen
14	(18) years of age or <del>less</del> <u>younger</u> ;
15	(8) The person is participating in a certified hunting safety
16	course sponsored by the commission or a firearm safety course recognized and
17	approved by the commission or by a state or national nonprofit organization
18	qualified and experienced in firearm safety;
19	(9) The person is participating in a school-approved educational
20	course or sporting activity involving the use of firearms; or
21	(10) The person is a minor engaged in lawful marksmanship
22	competition or practice or other lawful recreational shooting under the
23	supervision of his or her parent, legal guardian, or other person twenty-one
24	(21) years of age or older standing in loco parentis or is traveling to or
25	from this activity a lawful marksmanship competition or practice or other
26	<u>lawful recreational shooting</u> with an unloaded handgun or firearm accompanied
27	by his or her parent, legal guardian, or other person twenty-one (21) years
28	of age or older standing in loco parentis <del>,</del> or
29	(11) The person is authorized to carry a firearm or concealed
30	handgun on school property under § 6-15-1303.
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32	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-73-306(14), concerning the prohibition
33	against carrying a concealed handgun on school property, is amended to read
34	as follows:
35	(14) Any school, college, community college, or university campus

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1	$\underline{(A)}$ for the purpose of participating in an authorized
2	firearms-related activity; or
3	(B) Authorized to carry a concealed handgun on school property
4	<u>under § 6-15-1303;</u>
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6	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 15, Subchapter 13, is
7	amended to add a new section to read as follows:
8	6-15-1303. Existing school employees as security personnel.
9	(a)(1) A school district board of directors, upon recommendation of
10	the superintendent, may contract with an existing school employee for
11	additional pay to provide security during school hours in addition to his or
12	her other job duties.
13	(A) The supplemental security services contract for
14	additional pay shall be:
15	(i) On a monthly basis;
16	(ii) Outside of the normal employment contract; and
17	(iii) Outside of the scope and jurisdiction of the
18	Teacher Fair Dismissal Act of 1983, § 6-17-1501 et seq., and the Public
19	School Employee Fair Hearing Act, § 6-17-1701 et seq.
20	(B) The superintendent may withdraw immediately and cancel
21	the security services contract upon written notice to the employee, and the
22	employee shall receive on or before the next pay period payment for the
23	lesser of:
24	(i) The remainder of the contract term; or
25	(ii) Two (2) months' pay for security services.
26	(C) Upon notice of the cancellation of the contract, the
27	employee immediately shall return school-owned firearms, ammunition, safety
28	gear, or other items furnished by the district for security duties and shall
29	have the opportunity to remove personally owned firearms or equipment from
30	school property.
31	(2) An employee performing duties under the additional
32	contractual agreement under this section:
33	(A) May carry a firearm on school property;
34	(B) Shall complete a forty-hour training course at an
35	accredited law enforcement training academy in Arkansas that trains the
36	employee in:

1	(i) Fundamental use of firearms training including
2	firearm safety drills, tactics, and required qualification on an approved
3	<pre>course of fire;</pre>
4	(ii) Active shooter training;
5	(iii) Active shooter simulation scenarios;
6	(iv) Trauma care; and
7	(v) Defensive tactics;
8	(C) Shall complete annually an eight-hour training course
9	at an accredited law enforcement training academy in Arkansas to include:
10	(i) On-site tactical drills;
11	(ii) School safety drills; and
12	(iii) Firearms qualification on an approved course
13	of fire;
14	(D) Shall be licensed to carry a concealed handgun as
15	authorized by § 5-73-301 et seq.;
16	(E) Shall successfully pass a medical physical
17	examination;
18	(F) Shall maintain a valid Arkansas license to carry a
19	concealed handgun; and
20	(G) Shall renew at least annually the contract with the
21	school district to provide security under this section.
22	(b) A contract under this section shall be canceled if the person
23	contracted to provide the security under this section no longer holds a valid
24	Arkansas license to carry a concealed handgun.
25	(c)(1) A school district board of directors may enter into memorandums
26	of understanding with other school districts regarding when, where, and under
27	what circumstances the security officer of one (1) district may be present at
28	school functions involving the other school district.
29	(2) The authorization to be a security officer for one (1)
30	school district does not authorize the use of that security officer by
31	another school district.
32	(d)(1) The decision of the superintendent or school district board of
33	directors to cancel the security services contract is final and not subject
34	to an appeal or a grievance hearing.
35	(2) The cancellation of an employee's supplemental security
36	employment does not affect the employee's other employment with the district.

1	(e) A person contracted to provide security under this section shall
2	undergo the standard psychological evaluation for law enforcement personnel
3	and shall be subject to a background check.
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5	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the safety of our schools is
7	of paramount importance; that in some instances, the security of our schools
8	should be increased if the school feels that its own security measures are
9	lacking; and that this act is immediately necessary because the participating
10	law enforcement academies who will conduct the training will need time to
11	implement the curriculum before the next school year. Therefore, an emergency
12	is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the
13	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
14	on:
15	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
16	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
17	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
18	bill; or
19	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
20	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
