SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 21-1-402 (b)-(e), concerning restrictions on state employment of spouse's of constitutional officers, is amended to read as follows:

- (b) No person whose spouse <u>or former spouse</u> is elected to a constitutional office may, after the spouse <u>or former spouse</u> is elected to the constitutional office and during the term for which the spouse <u>or former spouse</u> is elected, enter into employment with any state agency without the prior approval of the Joint Budget Committee during a legislative session, the Legislative Council between legislative sessions, and the Governor.
- (c) This subchapter does not prohibit the spouse <u>or former spouse</u> of any constitutional officer from being elected and serving in an elected office or from being appointed to fill the vacancy in any elected office.
- (d) Any person who was employed by a state agency prior to the person's spouse <u>or former spouse</u> being elected a constitutional officer and any person who entered into employment with a state agency during the spouse's <u>or former spouse's</u> service as a constitutional officer is subject to the following:
- (1) The person's position shall not thereafter be reclassified unless it is the result of a general reclassification affecting all positions of the class and grade equally, nor shall the person, while the spouse or former spouse serves as a constitutional officer or within two (2) years after the spouse or former spouse leaves office, be promoted or transferred without the prior approval of the Joint Budget Committee during a legislative session, the Legislative Council between legislative sessions, and the Governor; and
  - (2) The person shall not receive any pay increase in excess of fifteen percent (15%) without the prior approval of the Joint Budget Committee during a legislative session, the Legislative Council between legislative sessions, and the Governor.
- (e) A former member of the General Assembly, and his or her spouse, and his or her former spouse shall not be eligible to be employed by any state agency within twenty-four (24) months after the member leaves office in any job or position that:
- 34 (1) Was newly created by legislative action within the twenty-35 four (24) months prior to the member's leaving office; or

1	(2) had a maximum salary level increase of more than fifteen		
2	percent (15%) authorized by legislative action within the twenty-four (24)		
3	months prior to the member's leaving office.

5	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 21-1-407 is amended to read as follows:		
6	21-1-407. Employment by state agency.		
7	A person whose spouse or former spouse is elected to a constitutional		
8	office may be employed by a state agency without the approval of the		
9	employment required by § 21-1-402(b) if the person's entry salary does not		
10	exceed the amount prescribed by Level 4 of Grade 13 of the state compensation		
11	plan found in § 21-5-209.

13	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 21, Chapter 1, Subchapter 4, is amended		
14	to add an additional section to read as follows:		
15	21-1-409. Review of persons related to certain public officers before		
16	entering into state employment.		
17	(a) A person shall not enter into state employment without prior		
18	review by the House Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and		
19	the Senate Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs meeting		
20	jointly if the person is a relative of:		
21	(1) A constitutional officer;		
22	(2) An agency director; or		
23	(3) An agency deputy director.		
24	(b) Under this section "relative" means:		
25	(1) A person who is related by consanguinity or affinity within		
26	the second degree; and		
27	(2) A former spouse.
