12	WHEREAS, a study of an exemption to the state sales tax for veterans
13	who are determined by the federal government to be one hundred percent (100%)
14	disabled is necessary,

16	NOW THEREFORE,
17	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGING, CHILDREN AND YOUTH,
18	LEGISLATIVE & MILITARY AFFAIRS OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
19	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20	
21	THAT the House Committee On Aging, Children And Youth, Legislative $\&$
22	Military Affairs study an exemption to the state sales tax for veterans who
23	are determined by the federal government to be one hundred percent (100%)
24	disabled.
25	
26	BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the study be conducted with the assistance
27	of the Department of Finance and Administration, which shall:
28	(1) Provide to the committee information concerning the state
29	sales tax and other states' sales taxes that are selected by the committee;
30	(2) Provide to the committee information concerning an exemption
31	to the state sales tax for veterans who are determined by the federal
32	government to be one hundred percent (100%) disabled and other states'
33	exemptions to sales tax that are selected by the committee; and
34	(3) Report to the committee all information required by the
35	committee for this study by December 1, 2014.
